Now, let us turn to I Corinthians, chapter 13 and read a part of verse 13. "And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three;"

I have been considering this text and have decided to use this one verse for the next three broadcasts. I want to take these three things: faith, hope, and charity and break them apart and examine each one of them carefully, and then in the third week, when we have the message upon charity, put them back together again and see the completeness of these fundamental virtues!

So, now, for our first message of the three graces, we shall concern ourselves primarily at this time with the subject of faith. This is the first step toward God and an indispensable one. First let us consider what it is. In Hebrews, 11th chapter and verse one, we read:

"Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

This is the best definition I know. However, in Webster's Dictionary we find that faith is defined as: allegiance to duty or a person; belief and trust in and loyalty to God; firm belief in something for which there is no proof. So we see then that faith is accepting that which cannot be proved by natural reasoning. Let me be quick to add that even though certain things cannot be proved by human reasoning, neither can their existence be disproved by the same method. This is why so many today are unwilling to accept anything which they cannot fully understand by the standards of human reasoning.

The old proverb which says to: "Believe nothing you hear and only half of what you see," is all too often used as a yardstick in this modern age of scientific learning, and ever-increasing knowledge. But I am here to tell you that what we need is a return to the fundamental teaching of the holy scriptures and a firm belief in the existence of the eternal things as recorded in their holy pages.

Do you know why more people are not pleasing God? Let me show you in Hebrews 11, and verse 6.

"But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that

It does not say it is necessary for you to prove that God does exist and to prove that he created the world and all things in it, for the so-called smart men of all ages have been endeavoring to prove or disprove this, and they are still uncertain as to the proof of many things that exist today.

But it does say that you must "believe" that he is and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him. Real, living, and active faith in God will bring about results and cause one to have peace of mind and heart while others are trying to delve into the deep and hidden secrets of God which they will never be able to prove by human understanding, regardless of how much learning and knowledge they gain. Look at I Corinthians 1 and verse 18:

"For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness; but unto us which are saved it is the power of God."

Then look again beginning at verse 22: "For the Jews require a sign and the Greeks seek after wisdom."

If we were able to see and know all of the wisdom and understanding of God, it would no longer be faith. But faith is accepting the word of God and acting upon it as such.

When Christ was resurrected and appeared to his disciples, Thomas said. "Except I shall see in his hands the prints of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe." John 20:25.

Now, Thomas was one of those who had to be shown, but look what Jesus said to him in John 20, beginning at verse 27: "Then saith he to Thomas, reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing."

Give attention to the reply which Thomas made in verse 28: "My Lord and my God." And finally, the outstanding blessing which Jesus handed down to all of us in verse 29: "Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed."

Now, no doubt, many of you have heard the old proverb: "Seeing is believing." Yes, this may be true, but seeing is not faith, for a real living and active faith goes far beyond that which meets the natural eye and takes in all the promises of God!

Here Jesus himself said: "Blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed."

Some may say that sounds good, but how do I get this faith? Here again we find the answer in Romans 10 and verse 17: "So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God."

This message right now is your invitation to have faith in God. Faith will bring real deliverance from sin and evil habits of life; it will give you peace of mind and heart; it will entitle you to the promises in the scriptures and to use them for your salvation; it will help you to please

God and to live peaceably with all men; and finally, it is the only means by which we may gain the eternal reward at the end of life. For Paul said: "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith: Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of rightecusness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day." II Timothy 4:7-8.
