For our lesson today I would like for you to consider the importance of

OBEDIENCE

For the scripture reading please look at the last part of a verse found in I Samuel 15:22. "Behold to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams."

Since the beginning of creation when man was placed in the garden of Eden, one of the leading sins has been disobedience. The first man Adam was plagued with this trouble as you may readily see in Romans 5:19. "For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous."

From this point on the sin of disobedience was prevalent. It found its way into the lives of great and wonderful leaders such as Moses, Samson, David, and Saul. This also included the prophet Jonah. In the lesson for today King Saul had been given a task to destroy the Amalekites and their possessions, but he failed to carry out this commandment to the satisfaction of Samuel.

King Saul pretended to be saving the cattle to offer for a sacrifice unto the Lord. Then he further excused himself by blaming the people for having saved the sheep and oxen but Samuel was not blinded to Saul's disobedience and plainly told him: "Behold to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams."

Even so today, I believe that one of the great secrets of a successful life is that of learning obedience. It is wirtten of Christ himself that He learned obedience by the things which he suffered.

Now, certainly it is encouraging to see those who are willing to venture for the right and stand for the truth amidst the dangers on every hand. Listen to the poetry about Jonah who disobeyed God.

Now, Jonah one time by the Lord had been sent To Nineveh, to have the people repent; He jumped on a boat, to Joppa did sail, And got into trouble, perhaps with a whale.

A tempest was raging while Jonah did sleep, And he was cast overboard into the deep; A fish passing by as the water he struck, Decided to swallow old Jonah for luck.

And good luck to Jonah it proved to be— He sailed for three days in the fish in the sea; Now Jonah was tough, and he wouldn't digest, And shortly the fish became greatly distressed. And said to himself, "I believe it is true, I've bitten off more than I ever can chew; This pain in my stomach was never before;" And he with an effort cast Jonah ashore,

And now then, I think, unless I'm deceived; That Jonah as well as the fish was relieved; For he from imprisonment now was released, And the pain in the fish was greatly decreased.

Then here is a little more poetry concerning David and Goliath.
