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"LIFT UP YOUR EYES, AND LOOK ON THE FIELDS; FOR THEY ARE WHITE ALREADY TO HARVEST." - JOHN 4:35

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. . . Greetings once again to all the listeners of radio station XEG. This is Willie Murphey speaking to you with another weekly broadcast for THE MISSION TRAIL, of Guthrie, Oklahoma. It indeed brings me great pleasure to be coming your way tonight for a little visit in your home or in your automobile as you drive along the highways of the nation. I hope that at the end of the next fifteen minutes you will feel that it was good for us to meet by means of radio. I also hope that those of you who hear this message tonight will take the time to write us a few lines and let us know of your interest in serving the Lord.

We have indeed been made happy because of a number of new listeners which have written to us in recent days. It gives us renewed courage to continue with this work of faith to help spread the Word of God both by radio and by the weekly printed copies which we mail. Now, no doubt, there are others who would like to receive these weekly messages. If so, all that is necessary for you to do is just to write us a letter and express your interest in having your name added to our mailing list. There is no charge or subscription price. It is free for the asking. I am speaking now of the weekly printed messages. Just mail your letter to us this way: THE MISSION TRAIL, Guthrie, Oklahoma, or you may address it to Willie Murphey, Guthrie, Oklahoma. Now Guthrie is spelled G-u-t-h-r-i-e. That's Guthrie, Oklahoma. We would like to hear from you wherever you may be hearing this broadcast, and you may expect a personal reply from us within a few days.

But now let us turn to the scriptures for our text. In Mark, chapter 1 and beginning at verse 40, we read: "And there came a leper to him, beseeching him, and kneeling down to him, and saying unto him,

IF THOU WILT,

thou canst make me clean. And Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth his hand, and touched him, and saith unto him, I WILL; be thou clean. And as soon as he had spoken, immediately the leprosy departed from him, and he was cleansed."

I see that these verses are filled to capacity with the goodness of God. I hope that we shall be able to condense

a little of their greatness into this next fifteen minutes, and that you will at the end of this broadcast feel that your life will not be quite the same ever again as it was before.

First notice the small word IF. Now this is one of the smallest of all the words in the English language, but it is a powerful word and one used so often in our daily conversation. In fact, we could hardly carry on a normal conversation for very long if we did not use the word IF.

Then let us see what the definition of the word is. From the dictionary I quote: "In case that; supposing that." End of quote. All right then, this would be making a supposition or taking things for granted. Let us go another step further. Here is the definition from the dictionary for the word suppose. I quote, "To assume as true for the sake of argument." End of quote.

Now don't forget the text. "If thou wilt." But speaking of supposition for the sake of argument, let me remind you that Satan is an expert with this word if. Listen to him speak now as he appeared to Christ in the hour of his temptation when Jesus was hungry: "If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread."

Now Satan knew that Christ was the Son of God, but here the enemy endeavored to inject into him a doubt. He was not satisfied to ask him once this question, but came to him the second time in the same manner. "If thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down:" In other words, he was using the word "if" for a stumbling stone, hoping that by this Christ would be confused. Nevertheless, Jesus successfully overcame this temptation when he said, "It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God."

Now since Satan failed to succeed in his first two temptations given to the Master, he used a little different approach on the third time, and yet hoped to use this same, but powerful, word "if". So he said in Matthew 14:9, "If thou wilt fall down and worship me."

This was after he had shown Christ all the kingdoms and glory of the world

which was under his dominion. We would say that Satan had more or less conceded the fact that Jesus was the Son of God, but he said, if thou wilt fall down and worship me, I will give thee all this glory. Once again Christ was not to be misled and stumble into such a cunning trap. So he said, "Get thee hence, Satan; for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve."

Now the thing which kept Christ in this time of temptation was his will to obey the Father. Satanknew that if this will were broken down, Christ would have failed in his mission to save those that believe from their sins.

Therefore, as Christ was faithful because his will was steadfast, we also should not allow our goal in life to be thwarted because of a lack of grace to keep us from yielding to the doubts instilled by the deceptive word "if".

Let us look at it from another angle. There are those today who are ever willing to shift the responsibility of their own unto others. They offer the excuse as to why they are not doing the thing which they know they should be doing. They say it this way: "If my wife was saved, then I would live for God," or they might say, "If my husband was willing to accept the truth, then I would gladly go along with him," or they might again use the little word by saying, "If my children were only different, then it would be much easier for me to do the right thing."

But listen to this scripture in Isaiah 1:19. "If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land: But if ye refuse and rebel, ye shall be devoured with the sword: for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it."

Friends, let me tell you something.

Your salvation and your welfare is not primarily dependent upon what others do, but it is hinged upon your own will. If you chose to allow others to stand in your way, you will miserably fail in life. And just as the leper said to the Master, "If thou wilt, thou canst make me clean," even so let us cast aside our doubts and fears of what may happen in the future and disregard the opposition which others may give and let us have the definite, positive, answer, "I will", even as Christ answered the leper, "I will; be thou clean." Therefore, I hope that each of you who hear this broadcast tonight will cast out the "ifs" which stand in your way and will arise to do for God that for which he has so long waited. Will you do it? Will you make that choice tonight? If thou wilt, thou canst be made whole.

Listen now as Kathleen and Patsy bring to you this poem.
