But as we lift up our eyes and look upon the great unfinished task before us, we are hoping that the new year of 1967 will bring even greater victories as we press onward to carry the gospel to the ends of the earth. Listen now to the first verse of Psalms 127.

"EXCEPT THE LORD BUILD THE HOUSE,

they labour in vain that build it: except the Lord keep the city, the watchman waketh but in vain."

This verse clearly points our how utterly dependent we are upon God. Except God is in a thing it is vain and hopeless for us to try to support it within our own selves.

You see, this verse also says, "except the Lord keep the city, the watchman waketh but in vain." In other words we must realize that our ability and strength is very limited, but through God we can accomplish his purpose for us regardless of the obstacles.

After the apostle Paul had given instructions to the elders of the church at Ephesus, he then realized that it was only God that could keep and support them.

In Acts, chapter 20 and verse 32, he gave this very encouraging scripture when he said, "And now, brethren, I commend you to God, and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up, and to give you an inheritance among all them which are sanctified." If we will stand for God's truth, I believe he will vindicate himself in behalf of the gospel.

Listen now to this prophecy which speaks of the coming of Christ. From Isaiah, chapter 9 and beginning with verse 6 we read: "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Of the increase of his government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his

kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will perform this."

Most people would, no doubt, agree that this scripture speaks of the birth of Jesus when he was born of the Virgin Mary, but when it comes to the establishing of the kingdom of God which verse 7 speaks of, many believe that this is to be done at some future time. But I want to declare unto you that Christ set up his kingdom and established it upon the day of pentecost and gave the church the commission of preaching his gospel throughout the world.

Listen to another prophecy from Daniel which speaks about the kingdom of God. In Daniel 2:44-45 we read, "And in the days of these kings shall the God of heaven set up a kingdom, which shall never be destroyed: and the kingdom shall not be left to other people, but it shall break in pieces and consume all these kingdoms, and it shall stand for ever.

"Forasmuch as thou sawest that the stone was cut out of the mountain without hands, and that it brake in pieces the iron, the brass, the clay, the silver, and the gold; the great God hath made known to the king what shall come to pass hereafter: and the dream is certain, and the interpretation thereof sure."

At the birth of Christ the Roman empire was at its zenith and controlled the known world of that day. This was the fourth world empire which was prophecied of in Daniel, but I want to tell you that Christ did set up his kingdom in the days of these kingdoms.

There is certainly no argument that the Roman empire fell with a crash under the weight of its own corruption. The early Christians withstood persecutions which are beyond words of description. But they conquered and they conquered through that name of Christ, our ever victorious king.

Listen to this reading from Daniel, chapter 4, beginning in verse 34, Neb-uchadnezzar said, "I blessed the most High, and I praised and honoured him that liveth for ever, whose dominion is an everlasting dominion, and his kingdom is from generation to generation:

"And all the inhabitants of the earth are reputed as nothing: and he doeth according to his will in the army of heaven, and among the inhabitants of the earth: and none can stay his hand, or say unto him, What doest thou?"

There is a vast difference in the true church of God and man-made organizations. Members are accepted into organizations by merely joining, but one can only become a member of God's family through the new birth. This is a spiritual operation which takes place between an individual and God himself.

Then and then only is he created a new creature in Christ with new hopes, new aspirations, and new plans. Then he has fellowship with all others who are redeemed by the blood of Christ. One verse of a well known song says, "We reach our hands in fellowship to every blood washed one while love entwines about each heart in which God's will is done." I say that this is a kingdom beyond comparison with any earthly dominion.

Listen now to these verses in Phil., chapter 2, beginning with verse 9. "Wherefore Godalso hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things

in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

Then listen to these verses from Ephesians, chapter 1 and beginning with verse 20. "Which he wrought in Christ, when he raised him from the dead, and set him at his ownright hand in the heavenly places, Far above all principality, and power, and might, and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this world, but also in that which is to come: And hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the church, Which is his body, the fulness of him that filleth all in all."

Friends, one whose name is so great as this, would he not be the king of all the earth? If every knee should bow before him, would he not be greater in power than all the dominions of men? If he is greater than all the universe and the heavens thereof, then I say that he is the king of all the world, even today. I am glad to tell you that I am a member of his family. I am a citizen of his kingdom and the government is upon his shoulders.
