Within a few days, it will be time for us to turn our attention once again to the thoughts of a Mother's love. We hope that those who honor their mothers on Mothers' Day will not do so in word only, but will do so with a godly life, proving by their actions that they mean the words they say. Listen to this verse found in Ezekiel, chapter 16 and verse 44. "Behold, every one that useth proverbs shall use this proverb against thee, saying,

AS IS THE MOTHER, SO IS HER DAUGHTER."

I believe that strong emphasis should be placed upon the fact that the influence of a mother and her life, either good or bad, is often passed on to her children. The children learn words and habits from those who are older, especially from their parents. Therefore if a mother is loose in her character, too much cannot be expected of her daughter. It is time that we as lovers of the truth should emphasize the need of godly homes with parents who love God and set a right example before their children. Parents should be able to say, "follow me as I follow Christ."

Let me better illustrate it in this way. Not knowing the truth of this example I prefer to tell it only as a trueto-life illustration. It is reported that "a daughter came to a worldly mother

and said she was anxious about her sins, and she had been praying all night. The mother said, 'Oh, stop praying. I don't believe in praying. Get over all these religious notions, and I'll give you a dress that will cost \$500, and you may wear it next week to that party.

"The daughter took the dress, and she moved in the gay circle, the gayest of all the gay, that night. Sure enough all religious impressions were gone, and she stopped praying.

"A few months after this, when she came to die, she said in her closing moments: 'Mother, I wish you would bring me that dress that cost \$500.' The mother thought it a very strange request, but she brought it to please the dying child. 'Now,' said the daugh-

ter, 'Mother, hang that dress on the foot of the bed.' The dress was hung there--on the foot of the bed. Then the dying girl got up on one elbow and looked at the mother. Pointing to the dress, she said: 'Mother, that dress is the price of my soul.' Oh, what a momentous thing it is to be a mother."

In verse 49 of this same chapter in Ezekiel, we read, "Behold, this was the iniquity of thy sister Sodom, pride, fulness of bread, and abundance of idleness was in her and in her daughters, neither did she strengthen the hand of the poor and needy."

Friends, is this not typical of many who are in our land today who are filled with pride and living after the desires of the flesh, loving pleasures more than they love God? It is a shame, yet true, that many mothers are unworthy of the title of being a true mother. Instead of instructing their children in the things of God, they are setting before them an example of worldliness and evil habits.

Listen to this instruction from Titus chapter 2 and beginning with verse 3. The aged women likewise, that they be in behaviour as becometh holiness, not false accusers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things; That they may teach the young women to be sober, to love their husbands, to love their children, To be discreet, chaste, keepers at home, good, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of God be not blasphemed."

Now, friends, this is the word of God. I didn't write it. It was written long before I came into this world, and I am confident that it will be here in the scriptures when you and I are gone.

Now you can mark it down for sure that any nation which is founded upon such principles of godly homes is in a good position to long endure the onslaughts of the enemy of all righteousness. But when these principles are omitted, homes are going to continue to be wrecked, and children will be left to go their way through a cold unfriendly world without the advice of a godly mother.

Every child is a bundle of tremendous possibilities; and whether the child shall come to life, its heart attuned to the eternal harmonies, and after a life of usefulness on earth go to a life of joy in Heaven, or whether it shall jar eternal discord, and after a life of wrong-doing on earth it shall go to a home of impenetrable darkness and an abyss of immeasureable plunge, is being decided by nursery song and Sunday school lesson and evening prayer and walk and ride and look and frown, and smile. Oh, how many children there are in glory singing never-ending praise to our redeemer who were brought to God through Christian parentage!

Friends, let us as parents fulfill our duty and obligations to our children by bringing them up in the way which they should go.
