. . . It is a real pleasure to be bringing to all the listeners of radio station XEG another gospel message from the word of God. This is Willie Murphey speaking to you. Here is a scripture which I hope will prove as interesting to you as it has to me. It is found in the 8th chapter of Psalms, and I will begin reading at verse 3. "When I consider thy heavens, the work of thy fingers, the moon and the stars, which thou hast ordained;

WHAT IS MAN, THAT THOU ART MINDFUL OF HIM?

and the son of man, that thou visitest him? For thou hast made him a little lower than the angels, and hast crowned him with glory and honour. Thou madest him to have dominion over the works of thy hands; thou hast put all things under his feet: All sheep and oxen, yea, and the beasts of the field; The fowl of the air, and the fish of the sea, and whatsoever passeth through the paths of the seas. O Lord our Lord, how excellent is thy name in all the earth!"

Do these verses not give you a feeling of the greatness of God? When the writer considered the heavens, the moon, and the stars, then he realized how small and how insignificant we as human beings are. He wondered how God could be so mindful of us to visit us with the blessings which he daily sends our way.

And yet, I am fully convinced that God has a purpose for each life. We

might ask the question: "Why are we here?" Those who are concerned with their own gratification might guess at the answer and miss it, for they, no doubt, would say we are here for our own pleasure. Friends, let me warn you this is not the principal reason for which we are placed in the world.

Inasmuch as God has a purpose for the sun, the moon, the stars and all the elements of the universe, we believe he also has a purpose and a plan for each life. He is an all-wise creator, and He does have a purpose for each of us. In Romans 8:28 we read these words, "And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose!" Let me say it then in this way--God has an eternal purpose in all of his creation. It is not merely an afterthought.

Listen to what the Apostle Paul had to say about this in Ephesians, chapter

3 and beginning with verse 8. "Unto me, who am less than the least of all saints, is this grace given, that I should preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ; And to make all men see what is the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God, who created all things by Jesus Christ: To the intent that now unto the principalities and powers in heavenly places might be known by the church the manifold wisdom of God, According to the eternal purpose which he purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord. "

Now did you especially notice that last verse which I read? It says, "According to the eternal purpose which he purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord." You see, the purpose and will of God was revealed in Christ. It is only as we come in contact with him and learn to know him that we are able to ascertain his purpose and plan for us. Here we may find the perfect plan of God for our lives.

Now to briefly summarize this I would say first, that as we come in contact with Christ, our lives are transformed from one of sinfulness unto one of joy and happiness as we experience the boundless grace of God. You see, grace is unmerited favor. The penalty of death hung upon us, but through our Lord we are made new creatures in Christ. It gives us a new outlook on life. In fact, our ambitions and desires are changed as the purpose and plan of God is unfolded for us.

Now God does not only want us to be happy in this world, but He has provided better things for us--eternal glories which he has promised for those who are faithful to him. These are the things which we believe the righteous will inherit even after earthly cares of this life are over, or we might say as

one writer did, "After our earthly house of this tabernacle is dissolved," for then we shall have a building of God, a house not made with hands eternal in the heavens.

Seeing then that God has a plan for all of his creation, we as individuals should endeavor to find exactly the place where we can be best used of him. Furthermore, it is the purpose and will of God that every nation and individual should have the opportunity to hear the gospel message. This presents a tremendous challenge to each of us as we endeavor to fulfill this mission for God.

So let us ask ourselves this question, "How may I be best used to glorify God?" When we realize there are many enslaved by the chains of sin with habits and superstition and spiritual darkness who do not know of His saving grace, we are stirred with a fervent desire to reach them in some way before it is too late.

Jesus once said "I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work." John 9:4. Now we also have a space of time given us to work the works of God and fulfill his purpose in our lives.

Did you ever stop to think what might be the results if each of us should fail to find our purpose and place in the will of God? Who of us can tell the tragic results of a life without a purpose? It is likened unto a ship without a sail, or a plane without a compass, not knowing where their destination will end. Listen to these solemn lines.
