"One Thing Have I Desired of the Lord"

(Radio broadcast on Sunday, October 1, 1967.)

for our weekly visit. I have some very wonderful words from the scriptures to bring you. We hope you will stay tuned to this station for the next few minutes. Listen now to this scripture found in Isaiah 43:10 and 11. "Ye are my witnesses, saith the Lord, and my servant whom I have chosen: that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I am he: before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me. I, even I, am the Lord; and beside me there is no saviour."

I believe that these verses should be read often in the home, in the schools, and wherever else any occasion is given to read the scriptures. In the midst of doubt, unbelief, confusion, and strife it is a glorious thing to know that there is a living God, one who hears and answers prayer. It is indeed a comfort to those who are in distress and sorrow to know that the God whom we serve created the world and all who are in The universe was made by Him, and without Him was not anything made which exists. Furthermore, we believe that our life and breath come from God.

Did you notice the part of that verse which said, "before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me"? The next verse says virtually the same thing. "I, even I, am the Lord; and beside me there is no

saviour." It is time that people realized that they may as well quit looking for any other thing to bring peace and satisfaction in their lives.

You have a choice. You may accept the God of the universe, believe His word and believe in His son as your saviour, or you may throw your life away chasing the bubbles of life and the philosophies of men, and yet all of this will avail you nothing when you come to the end of your life.

I am especially interested in the first part of this tenth verse which says "Ye are my witnesses." In Acts, chapter 1 and verse 8 we read these words, "But ye shall receive power after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost

part of the earth." Now these are the last words our Saviour spoke before he was taken away from his disciples. He said, "ye shall be witnesses".

Friends, are you a good witness for your Lord? Can He use your words to testify before others? You see there is much to be done if we are to carry out the commission which the Lord left for his people to do before his return.

First, I believe that we should be good examples of holy living in our homes. Your wife or your husband should know the depth of your sincerity in serving the Lord. Your children should be taught and trained in the things of God. Are you witnessing before them each day? Do you leave their training to others who have not a love for our Lord?

Next, we should be ready to speak for our Lord on the job where we work. Now this is hard for some people to do. Do those about you know that you have been born again? Are your habits of life clean? Or do those with whom you work hear you speak curse words or slang words? What is the manner in which you dress and act before them? These things are important in the sight of God. Do others see Christ in your life? Are you ashamed of our Lord? Are you afraid of what men are going to say of you? God forbid! Our Lord is counting on every born again child of God to be a witness for Him.

Next, we should set forth a good example by our interest in the worship of God by attending services and meeting together with the Lord's people. You see, the church is the body of our Lord. The co-operation and work of many combine to make his church the light of the world. His true church is

the one which sets forth the standards of the gospel and follows the teachings of the Holy Scriptures.

Then, we should not be content to merely have the truth ourselves. Someone else might say then, "Well, everyone is not going to be saved anyway. They will not all accept the truth." Friends, this may all be true, but did you know that the preaching of the gospel serves two causes. First it is the savour of life unto life to those who believe. To the others who are disobedient and unbelieving it will serve as a witness against them. It will condemn their evil works.

Some of you may have heard about Charles Spurgeon, the noted evangelist of England. Says Mr. Spurgeon, "I cannot tell how much I owe to the solemn words and prayers of my good mother. It was the custom on Sunday evenings while we were children for her to stay We sat around the at home with us. table and read verse by verse, while she explained the Scripture to us. After that was done then came the time of pleading with God. And some of the words of our mother's prayers we shall never forget, even when our heads are I remember her once praying thus: 'Now, Lord, if my children go on in sin, it will not be from ignorance that they perish, and my soul must bear a swift witness against them at the day of judgment if they lay not hold of Jesus Christ. ' "

Certainly that would be a testimony, wouldn't it, friends, of our own mothers to say of us? Let us be the ones to heed the voice of God and be a witness to others. Will you pray with us and for us as we endeavor to reach others by means of radio and the literature which is mailed each week?

Recently I received a letter from a friend, and part of it was especially inspirational to me. She also is a young person, and she wrote: ". . . It is so wonderful how each one of us is included in God's plan of salvation. know as I am learning new trust in the Saviour, it's with the amazing delight and wonder of a little child discovering new enchantments. For it is something 'new' to me to be able to cast every burden at Jesus' feet. It's one thing to hear of it, another to actually experience the freedom of trusting in the Lord. "

I think so many times how we would be so much better off if we could learn to completely put our trust in God and not worry about the problems we have or the future. In Psalms 55:22 we are told, "Cast thy burden upon the Lord, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved." How much more we can enjoy life when we learn to take our problems to the Lord and leave them there! He has promised to take care of His children and help them come through their trials victoriously!

I think the Hebrew children were such good examples of having perfect trust in the Saviour when they were faced with the prospect of being thrown in the fiery furnace if they did not bow down to the idol that the king had made. In the 3rd chapter of Daniel they told the king, "We are not careful to a nswer thee in this matter. If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of thine hand, O king. But if not, be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up. "

They had their minds made up to serve God no matter what happened. If they were thrown in the fiery furnace, they knew the Lord could deliver them from it, but if He didn't, they were going to serve and trust Him anyway. They were put in the furnace, but one in the likeness of the Son of God walked with them, and they came out without a hair singed or the smell of fire on them. Later it proved a great blessing to them and was a testimony to those who had witnessed the scene.

I think a great part of the battle is won for living a consistent life for God when one has the firm decision that they are going to trust God regardless of what comes their way, and you may be sure that He will take good care of you!
