Sober-Minded Young People

Radio Broadcast for week of March 31, 1968--(See back page for list of stations)

. . . It is a real pleasure to bring to the listeners of this radio station a gospel message from the Word of God. There are some people who think that the Bible is for aged people or perhaps for children who love to hear Bible stories. Well, this is all true. It is, but it is for more than that. Let me tell you something. The Bible is designed to fit into the life of every individual. This is regardless of whether you are young or old. If you leave it out and the truths which it teaches, you may be sure you are going to miss the best things in life and the peace and happiness of the life hereafter.

Do you know the best time for a person to become established in the right way of living? Let me read it to you from Ecclesiastes 12:1. "Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth, while the evil days come not, nor the years draw nigh, when thou shalt say, I have no pleasure in them."

Notice that it said in the days of thy youth. It did not say for you to wait until you are sixty years old to begin remembering your creator, but it said in the days of thy youth. Now if you want to grow to be an aged man or woman who loves the Lord with a likeable personality and characteristics which people like to be around, then the time to start is in the days of your youth--not after you have grown old and hardened in sin.

And with that scripture, here is another one which is speaking to young people. Beginning with Titus 2:6, it says, "Young men likewise exhort to be sober minded. In all things shewing thyself a pattern of good works; in

doctrine shewing uncorruptness, gravity, sincerity. Sound speech, that cannot be condemned; that he that is of the contrary part may be ashamed, having no evil thing to say of you."

Friends, let me point out that the young people of today have many problems and temptations which our fathers never had to face. Listen as Patsy reads to you this letter from a young man living in India. Perhaps the report of how he overcame his temptations will be a help to others.

"Dear Bro. Willie Murphey and the rest of the family, Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ who is our good shepherd. Firstly I request you to be kind enough to excuse me for my long silence. I think you can understand me. I am the son of Brother C. M. Varghese, South India. I could not write to you for a long time because I was busy with my education. But now I finished with my education successfully by the measureless grace of God, and I am quite free now to do gospel

work which, I think, is the happiest and most powerful work.

"Dear brother, from my experience as a college student I understand that college life is a period of temptation for those who want to lead a holy life. With great regret I say that it is during this period that most of the young men are misled and distracted. But my dear God--the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob--helped me very much to win over these temptations of Satan. I really thank God for he heard my prayers and poured showers of blessings on me many times. My fellow students used to tell me that to see film-shows is an indispensable factor for a college student. They persuaded and compelled me many times for that. But by God's grace I have not seen ever a single film show yet in my life. But it does not mean that the mere fact of not seeing film-shows alone will make a person's life holy.

"But the question is how can I show my gratitude to God in return. It will be better for me if I can win over even a single soul which is in the darkness of sin to place before God. Yes, if God allows I shall try my best to fulfill that aim during the rest of my life. I pray to God to give me a heart to cry for many young people of South India who are in the darkness of sin as the prophet Jeremiah cried for the men of Israel.

"I pray for you and all the members of your family and also for your broadcast. May God bless your useful and valuable works there. Please pray for me also. I request you to continue to send The Mission Trail to me and also to my father during this year also. With best wishes, Yours in Him,"

Thank you, John, for that encouraging letter from South India. It is our sincere wish and hope that God may use you for a great influence among the young people of India. We know that it is possible for young people to be sober minded and to live a godly life.

And now, friends, I want you to listen to the words of a quotation which were written about eighty years ago and were included in an introduction to a Bible story book. The writer is speaking of the temptations of the youth. Here they are. I quote.

"What a battle they have to do right when there are so many influences combining to make them do wrong! It may be almost impossible to take a castle by straightforward siege, but suppose in the night there is a traitor within, and he goes down and draws the bolt and swings open the great door, and then the castle falls immediately. That is the trouble with the hearts of the young; they have foes without and foes within.

"There are a great many who try to make our young people believe it is a sign of weakness to be pure. The man will toss his head and take dramatic attitudes and tell of his own indiscretions, and ask the young man if he would not like to do the same; and they call him verdant, and they say he is green and unsophisticated, and wonder how he can bear the puritanical straitjacket. They tell him he ought to break from his mother's apron strings, and they say, 'I will show you all about town. Come with us. You ought to see the world. It won't hurt you. you please, but it will be the making of you. 1

"After a while the young man says,

'I don't want to be odd, nor can I afford to sacrifice these friends, and I'll go and see for myself.' From the gates of hell there goes a shout of victory. Farewell to all innocence! Farewell to all early restraints favorable to that innocence, which once gone, never comes back! I heard one of the best men I ever knew, 75 years of age, say, 'Sir, God has forgiven me for all the sins of my lifetime; I know that, but there is one sin I committed at 20 years of age that I will never forgive myself for. It sometimes comes over me overwhelmingly, and it absolutely blots out my hope of heaven. '

"Young man, hear it! How many traps there are set for young people." End of quote.

Now, friends, those words were written something like eighty years ago. If it is true in those days and was true in those days that many temptations awaited the young people, how much more is it true today. And please do not forget the scripture found in Galatians 6:7 which says, "Be not deceived; God is not mocked; for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." Here is a poem which says:

Trust in God and Do the Right

Courage, brother! do not stumble, Though thy path be dark as night; There's a star to guide the humble--"Trust in God and do the right." Though the road be long and dreary And the goal be out of sight, Foot it bravely, strong or weary; "Trust in God and do the right."

Perish policy and cunning, Perish all that fears the light; Whether losing, whether winning, "Trust in God and do the right." Fly all forms of guilty passion, Friends can look like angels bright; Heed no custom, school, or fashion; "Trust in God and do the right."

Some will hate thee, some will love thee, Some will flatter, some will slight; Cease from man, and look above thee; "Trust in God and do the right." Simple rule and surest guiding, Inward peace and shining light, Star upon our path abiding--"Trust in God and do the right."

Patzcuaro, Baja California: "Dear Saints and Friends, I greet you today in Jesus' name. How glad I am to be a child of God and to know His love and protection for both body and soul. I have had some experiences lately to prove to me more and more of how good God is and powerful to protect us. I am certainly far from being discouraged in the Christian race from earth to glory. Some say God is dead, but I am glad to say that my God is not for He is very real to me, and I love Him.

"I have had some trouble with my car, and one time it broke down at night out in the desert and the nearest town was 30 to 40 miles away. Ibegan hitch hiking as I didn't know anything else to do. An American gave me a ride to the nearest town. By his conversation I know that God in heaven protected me from danger. In town I purchased the needed transmission fluid and went to the bus station, all to find out that the next one would be at 8:00 the next morning. Not having money for a hotel, I began my journey back to the car hitch hiking. I walked for a long time, knowing it would take me quite some time on foot to go the 30 some miles. I asked the Lord to help me and protect me. I was given a ride by some Mexican men who took me to the car. In both rides that were given me I had the opportunity to tell them of God's love to man and Hisplan in which we can be saved from sin. The Lord helped us to get home all right, and we had heartfelt gratitude for all the Lord did for us there. We need to get in hard places at times to be able to see more of the mercy and love of God.

"The Lord has been with usin a real

good way in the services--blessing us with anointing and His presence. There has been good attendance at all the meetings--twice on Sunday and once on Wednesday. Last night I counted the people, and there were 36, but yesterday morning there were more out. There are those who feel a need of the Lord from time to time and give good testimonies. . .

"Although the sewing classes keep me busy with all the other duties, Iam very well satisfied in their accomplishments. It is rewarding to see the young ladies and girls on their way to school in the clothes they have made. One time I taught them to make pancakes. They all liked that very much. They have wanted me to teach them to make some American food for quite some time, but it is hard to do because so many of them don't have stoves to cook on-just an adobe something built up on sticks with the top of a metal barrel cut out and sitting on top of that.

"In closing I want to thank each one of you for your prayers in my behalf and for all who are endeavoring to serve the Lord here in Mexico. We may be on the front lines, but there is more to it than the front lines as it is the work of the Lord, and we are workers together for one cause--God's cause--the salvation of souls. . .

"I have been asked by different ones here to request prayer for them for their bodies--one with tumors, goiter, T. B., and crippling arthritis. All of these claim to be saved and they need your prayers. May God bless each one. Your sister in Christ,"


we understand:
