Be Clean

Radio Broadcast for week of June 2, 1968 (See back page for list of stations)

. . . It is indeed a pleasure to be on the air again and bringing to the listeners of THE MISSION TRAIL broadcast another message from the Word of God. We hope that you will keep your radio tuned to this station for the next few minutes, and then it is our sincere wish and hope that your life will be enriched by the scriptures and the thoughts presented. Listen now to this: "Depart ye. depart ye, go ye out from thence, touch no unclean thing; go ye out of the midst of her; be ye clean, that bear the vessels of the Lord. " Isaiah 52:11. What do you suppose that means? Does that sound to you as if God will allow a person to continue in sin each day both in word and deed? Well, it doesn't seem to me that He intended it to work that way. He desires a person to depart from that which is unclean. I know that may be unpopular teaching in these days, but we should base our lives not on what people think but on what the Word of God teaches.

I remember one favorite scripture of an aged saint. You see, many people have their eyes on the hypocrite and the professor who has no real heartfelt salvation. There are those who will let these kind of people stand in their way, but here is the scripture which he used to refer to. "Mark the perfect man, and behold the upright: for the end of that man is peace." How then could the Lord point out a perfect

man if there were none? How could He say the end of the upright was going to be peace if there were none upright? If that sounds out of line to you, let us turn to the scriptures and see what they teach. Here in Jeremiah 33:8 we find these words: "And I will cleanse them from all their iniquity, whereby they have sinned against me; and I will pardon all their iniquities, whereby they have sinned, and whereby they have transgressed against me." If all your iniquities were pardoned, how many would there be standing against you? I would say none.

Here is another scripture speaking about being clean from idols. Listen: "Then will I sprinkle clean water upon you, and ye shall be clean: from all your filthiness, and from all your idols, will I cleanse you." Ezekiel 36:25. I believe that in this gospel day the Lord's people are delivered from all their sins.

One may say, yes, but that is in the old prophecies. All right, I accept that.

It is in the old prophecies, but often they foreshadow the coming of a better day which we really enjoy now. But listen to this verse from the New Testament. "Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God." II Corinthians 7:1.

Then listen to the record of Paul. "And when they opposed themselves, and blasphemed, he shook his raiment, and said unto them, Your bloodbe upon your own heads; I am clean: from henceforth I will go unto the Gentiles." So I see that Paul managed to get through without the blood of others being upon him. The only way to do that is to live clean before God.

Isaiah 1:16 says, "Wash you, make you clean; put away the evil of your doings from before mine eyes; cease to do evil." Now I am not speaking about being washed with soap and water because your skin is dirty, of course, that is sometimes necessary, too, you know, but I am talking about an inward work and grace brought about in the heart of an individual when they are cleansed from their sins by the divine power of God.

Jesus said, 'Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you.' John 15:3. And again we find in Eph. 5:26, here it is speaking of Christ and the church. I quote: "That he might sanctify and cleanse it by the washing of water by the word."

The writer of the Psalms had a vision of what it meant for a young man to be clean. Listen, young people, I hope you will hear it. You know it is a beautiful thing to see a young man or woman who is pure in spirit, body, and

soul. There are those who seem to think that in these days young people should not be bound by the teachings of the Bible or the moral standards of yesterday. They want them to have liberty of conscience and thought, to do and act as they please. But listen to this verse. "Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed thereto according to thy word." That one is found in Psalm 119:9.

Now let me show you what it means to be really clean. James 4:8 says, "Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your heart, ye double minded." Clean hands would represent an upright The things that you deal with would not soil your hands. Here in Psalm 24:4 it is speaking about those who are going to stand in the holy place and it says, "He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully." Now that verse mentions hands and heart being clean. The heart would represent the inmost thoughts of your being.

When a person has an earnest desire to have a clean heart, he will be willing and ready to say like the writer did in Psalm 51:10. "Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me. " And Jesus said, "Blessed are the pure in heart; for they shall see God. " Matthew 5:8. I just do not believe Jesus would have said that if it were impossible to have a pure heart. Not only is it possible to have clean hands and a clean heart, but finally we read from Hebrews 10:22, "Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, having our hearts sprinkled from an evil conscience, and our bodies washed with pure water."

Can you now see what the scripture

means when it says, "Be ye clean, that bear the vessels of the Lord." I believe God expects clean heart, clean hands, and a clean life, or it would never have taught it in His word. If you are not satisfied with your experience, I hope that you will soon find the fountain of cleansing flowing from Calvary. Let us pray.

We are glad that the blood of Christ is able to wash away every guilty sin and give peace and pardon in its place. Bless each one who hears the message today and enrich their lives by the word of God, and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen




