Lord, What Wilt Thou Have Me to Do?

Radio Broadcast for week of July 28, 1968 (See back page for list of stations)

. . . a very cheerful greeting to all the listeners of THE MISSION TRAIL broadcast of Guthrie, Oklahoma. We hope that each of you are well and enjoying the blessing of the Lord during these hot summer months. Listen to this challenging question. I venture to say that if each of you would ask this question honestly and then abide by the answer which the Lord gives, your experience would be greatly enriched in Him. Here it is. It is found in Acts 9:6, "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" Would you like to know who asked that question and when and where? Alright, let us go back into the New Testament Bible history and take notice of a man who was called Saul. This man had been brought up a Pharisee and was very devoted to what he believed was right, even to the persecuting of the early Christians causing them to blaspheme if possible and it was he who was present and kept the clothes of those who stoned the first martyr for Christ, Stephen. Do you remember reading of that?

The spread of Christianity was one thing which troubled him greatly. Therefore he sought and received of the high priest at Jerusalem permission to go to Damascus and seek any disciple which he might find there and bring them to Jerusalem for punishment. Can you see him on the way to Damascus with those legal documents in his possession at a time when his heart was steeled against mercy? But as he approached near the city suddenly an intense light flashed from heaven full upon the persecutor which so dazzled him that he fell to the ground in great fear. As he lay there he heard a voice saying to him from heaven, "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?" Saul realized that the voice came not from one of this earth, so he asked, "Who art thou, Lord?" He must have been all the more alarmed when the voice replied "Iam Jesus of Nazareth,

whom thou persecutest." I wonder if then he thought how he had treated the believers of Christ. I wonder if he remembered how he held the clothes of those who stoned Stephen. Do you suppose his voice was trembling when he asked this all important question, "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?"

Well, anyway he asked it and sure enough the answer was given. He was told what to do and he was told where to go, but in the meantime his sight was so blinded and his body so weak from fear that another led him by the hand as he went on his way to Damascus. There he was 3 days without sight and without food and without drink.

I wish more people would sincerely ask that question, "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" I believe that God

would reveal His will to them either through the Word or by His spirit or a messenger His in one way or another. Ananias was very hesitant to visit Saul when the Lord told him to do so, because he had already heard about what a wicked manhe was. But I wonder what might have been the result if Ananias had flatly refused to obey the will of God because of his fear of Saul. No doubt there would have been a missing link in Saul's life had Ananias drew back. But I am

glad that he didn't. He went right over there to that street which was called "Straight" and there he found Saul as the Lord had shown him.

From this time on the life of Saul was changed. He no longer sought to persecute the saints for then he was one of them. He chose like Moses did, to suffer affliction with the people of God rather than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season.

And friends, may I present this challenge to you. If you find the way you are traveling hard to go, if you find it is hard for thee to kick against the

pricks, (this means to go contrary to the will of God) then why don't you ask this question, "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" Now notice, it says 'me', not someone else. One should be asking sincerely for themselves.

I am reminded of the first miracle which Jesus performed—that of turning water into wine. His mother told those servants at the wedding, "Whatsoever he saith unto you do it." Now that was the secret of the miracle. It was in doing that which they were told to do. What do you suppose would have happened to Saul if he had gotten up from the ground, rubbed his eyes, and tried

to explain how some astronomical phenomenon had taken place and it just so happened that he was caught in the midst of it. Suppose he had continued on his mission of persecuting the saints. Well, friends, that is not for us to know what the result would have been. And I am glad that he not only asked the question, but I am glad he did what he was told to do, aren't you?

Now, let me bring this personally home to each of you. Consider this question: What shall I do with my life? First, be assured that God has a plan for your life. Next, dedicate your life to him and ask him to show you the work which he would have you do. You should remember that you are responsible to God for the talents he has given you and, of course, you should not merely seek for the easiest place in life, but ask yourself this question, where can I serve best? Now if you had a dozen lives to live you might possibly afford to waste one of them, but the fact is that you only have one life to invest, or lose. Which is it going to be with you? Listen to this scripture from I Cor. 6:19, 20, "and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.

Then, let me give you this word of encouragement, if you are really sincere and earnest in searching for the will of God this scripture should be a comfort to you. In John 7:17 we read, "If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself."

Our Father,

Give us not only earnestness and sin-

cerity in asking the question, "Lord, what wilt thou have me to do?" but give us a willing heart to please thee whatever the cost. Bless all those who hear the broadcast today. May they receive spiritual, physical, and financial blessings as they answer like one of the prophets of old, "Lord, here am I send me." And to thee we will give the praise through Christour Lord. Amen

As many of you all know I and our four older children became very ill the After a week of first week of July. terrible suffering we decided to go on to the Pacoima campmeeting to be near the ministers for prayer. phoned the day before for prayer and to see if there would be a place for us away from the grounds. Sis. Rada Watkins offered her home for which we James made a were very thankful. bed in the back of our Ford van and I and several of the children lay down on the way. Thursday we were anointed and prayed for. God touched, we all felt stronger. Friday the ministers were called again for prayer, and again Saturday. Bobby, our oldest boy, received healing Saturday. We were all thankful God touched us enough we were able to be in one or more services. The only regret we have is that we were ignorantly exposing others to our affliction.

After other symptoms developed we realized our affliction was more serious than we expected and possibly contagious. Monday we went back to Mexico. We dnesday before the campmeeting started there at Monark I went to a doctor to see how to protect others and also to affirm what we believed God was healing us of. After the examination the doctor told James, "She's in very serious condition. About the only cure for her is a month's hospital bed rest and some medications. But

I must wait until I get results from the laboratory tests before admiting her." A short discussion followed about trusting in God for healing but he payed little attention. Upon leaving he said to go home, go to bed, all the family stay away from people, no visitors, no excitement of any form.

Well, it so happens that James was chief cook and dish washer and while washing dishes a cup broke in his hand cutting his finger very badly. It needed stitches but he couldn't sew it as it was his right hand so just bandaged it up as best he could in a way that the wound closed up. All well now in 7 days.

The following afternoon a scorpion bit Patricia, our 10 year old daughter. She was James' only helper as Godhad healed her after four days of suffering. We went straight to prayer and of course didall we knew to do to keep the poison from spreading through her blood. The next morning my Bible fell open to "And he gave them power to tread over scorpions and serpents, and nothing shall by any means hurt you." Praise our God! I read it to her and asked, "Are you hurt?" and she answered, "No, only the spot where I was bitten is numb."

Two days later our three year old (who is just recovering from whooping cough) was on the back porch while Patricia was doing the family wash. While Patricia was picking up some clean clothes that had fallen the baby put her hand in the wringer of the washing machine. Another cause for excitement and prayer.

During all this excitement God was healing the other two children and myself. Our skin was changing rosy and flesh like again and the whites of our eyes were becoming white again. We were eating well again and the children were playing again.

Today is the day the doctor wanted me to come back so we went. I told him of the children. He said they are well. He was very surprised at my improvement. "I'm amazed at your improvement." He said, "You are almost normal!" He never mentioned a month in the hospital. He only said to come back for one more test, and if it turns out like I think we will just forget your case. God did in five days what the doctor thought would take a month. . .

We are on our way home now rejoicing that God was mindful of us, and all you saints were so thoughtful of us.
