Are You Ready?

Radio Broadcast for week of January 26, 1969 (See back page for list of stations.)

"Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh." Now it is one thing to talk about being ready and it is quite another thing to have your affairs all taken care of in such a way that you are really ready for the coming of the Lord. Some folks may say, "What do you mean by the coming of the Lord?" I mean just what this scripture says which I have just given you. "Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh." I have chosen to bring you a newspaper account of the life of the great great grandfather of Bro. Curtis Williams who now lives in Clearfield, Ky. I especially want you to notice one incident in particular. But here it is and I quote:

EVERYBODY LOVED UNCLE ROBIN GREEN OF ELLIOTT COUNTY

"Everybody loved Uncle Robin Green of Elliott County. There was that time in Cincinnati when he was put in jail...so let's say just about everybody. But what would you have done had you seen walking toward you on a Cincinnati street a man in white robe and Roman sandals, a long shepherd's crook in his hand, and a white beard that fell on his chest?

"Robert K. Green and his wife, Marinda Workman Green, both were born in Virginia. Robin (as he was later known) was born June 10, 1811, and Marinda on May 24, 1819. Robin was the son of James Green Jr., who was scalped and killed by old Chief Benge while on a hunting trip.

"Robin and Marinda were married in

Russell County, Va., and after the close of the Civil War the couple and five of their six children traveled to Kentucky and settled at what is known as Green, Elliott County. Their son, David C. Green, was sheriff of Elliott County years ago.

"Uncle Robin was decidedly religious and in his fervor wrote a book called 'Primitive Truth'.

"In his spiritual belief, Uncle Robin tried to be Christlike in everything he did, and starting from the inside out he clothed his heart and soul by going about the countryside doing good, being kind where kindness was needed, and being generous where generosity was required. When he got to the outside, he did not stop there, but discarded the dark heavy clothing of the Kentucky pioneer and in its place donned white robes, sandals and allowed his beard to grow untrimmed.

"It was not unusual for neighbors to see Uncle Robin emerging through the early morning mist on his way to sit at the bedside of the sick, or to attend some religious meeting to 'gather in the lost sheep.'

"On his daily jaunts about the countryside, he carried his shepherd crook, made with a forked end, and with it swept snow or dirt out of the way of his sandals.

"Having written his book, Primitive Truth, Uncle Robin knew that was not enough. He had to have his book published for all the lost sheep to read. So one day, clothed in his white, his sandals, and carrying his stick and manuscript he walked from the county to Greenup where he got on a boat to Cincinnati.

"Things did not go too well in Cincinnati, where he was placed in jail. Gotham was not used to seeing Christlike men walking down the street... but most cities, towns, hamlets might have reacted in like manner.

"When Uncle Robin was released and started on his way home to his familiar Elliott County, it was on a Sunday. Now Robin observed the Sabbath wherever he was. Shortly after leaving the boat he came upon a small country church, door open, and congregation seated listening to the closing remarks of a sermon. The preacher had asked the question, 'How many would be ready to meet your Savior should he come right now?' Almost every hand in the room was raised.

"At that moment, Uncle Robin, whitebearded, white-clothed and sandaled, walked through the door! "Descendants of the old zealot say the preacher was the first one out, breaking a window. Only one woman remained to greet her 'Savior.'

"In 1869, the book was published.

"Robin lived out his days in Elliott County, working for his Lord and Savior to the end, continuing to devote his life to doing good, being kind and compassionate of the frailties of his fellowman.

"He was buried on a high, gently sloping Elliott County hill on the farm of his son, David C. Green, his wife by his side.

"But as the old man believed, who is there to say he is not walking the streets of Gold, robed in white, and sandals on his feet?"

Now, friends, what do you think of that? Do you suppose those people who raised their hands in the church that morning actually thought that Christ was going to return that soon? Well I doubt it, and what do you think of the preacher that presented the question to the congregation? It looked rather bad for him to break a window to be the first one out! Do you suppose he thought that Christ was going to catch him unprepared? Do you suppose when the Lord really does return again that he will find a lot of folks not ready? I am persuaded he will, my friends. And in that number isn't it quite likely that there may be some preachers too? I would say yes. And now will you listen to these solemn words once again which Christ used to exhort his disciples, "Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh." Now, dear ones, let us not be among

those who procrastinate and think, O well, I don't need to change my life to-day. I'll wait until some future time. We do not know neither the day nor the hour in which our Lord shall return. He left us his word that he was coming and of course the angels said that he would come in like manner as you have seen him go. Let us not be among those who are careless and slothful and unconcerned about our Lord's will and commission but may we take it to heart and be found doing what he left us to do when he does return.

Let us pray,

Our gracious Father,

Since we know not, (neither the day nor the hour in which you shall appear to call the world to judgment, to reward the saints, and to send forth everlasting punishment against the wicked) we pray that you will help us to be ready each moment of each day of our lives. Bless the broadcast to the good of all who hear and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen

And may I remind you that this message has been brought your way over this radio station by The Mission Trail of Guthrie, Oklahoma. It is our sincere desire to exalt the Christ of the Bible and to present him to those who need him most! And now this final scripture beginning in Luke 21:34, "And take heed to yourselves, lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkenness, and cares of this life, and so that day come upon you unawares. For as a snare shall it come on all them that dwell on the face of the whole earth. Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man."

Now, friends, I hope these scriptures and these thoughts may cause each one who hears the broadcast to think solemnly and to be sure that they've made preparations to meet the Lord. Now until we meet again this is Willie Murphey saying may God's richest blessings be with each of you. 
