The Promised Messiah - - Part 4

Radio Broadcast for week of January 4, 1970 (See back page for list of stations.)

A happy new year to each and every listener of THE MISSION TRAIL broadcast. May the God of all grace, comfort, and peace guide you with his unerring wisdom throughout each day of the new year. We are thankful to God for his blessings during the year 1969 and we sincerely hope that this year of 1970 may bring greater victories for the cause of God. As the powers of evil combine to crush and defeat may we as God's people catch the vision and the need to put our whole hearts and lives into his cause while it is yet day for the night cometh when no man can work.

For the last several weeks I have been dealing with the subject "The promised Messiah". I have discussed the manner of his coming and given the scriptures showing how the prophecies were fulfilled. On the previous broadcast we were considering the "object of his coming" and we have seen how that he did set up his kingdom in the world even though his kingdom is not of the world. It is a spiritual kingdom consisting of all the saved people. Let us look into this "object of his coming" a little further at this time. Listen to this prophecy in Isa. 35 and beginning with verse 4, "Say to them that are of a fearful heart, Be strong, fear not: behold, your God will come with vengeance, even God with a recompence; he will come and save you. Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf shall be unstopped. Then shall the lame man leap as an hart, and the tongue of the dumb sing: for in the wilderness shall waters break out, and streams in the desert. And the parched ground shall become a pool, and the thirsty land springs of water:

in the habitation of dragons, where each lay, shall be grass with reeds and rushes. And an highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called The way of holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it; but it shall be for those: the wayfaring men, though fools, shall not err therein. No lion shall be there, nor any ravenous beast shall go up thereon, it shall not be found there; but the redeemed shall walk there: And the ransomed of the Lord shall return, and come to Zion with songs and everlasting joy upon their heads: they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away." Now that is a good prophecy and filled with many good things. But the question might arise in the minds of some folks, just when is that prophecy going to be fulfilled? Some are waiting for it to happen off out there in the future. They know not when nor how. But I say to you that the coming of the Messiah and the preaching of the gospel ushered in the kingdom of God which brought about the fulfillment of these prophecies. We are living in the gospel day right

now. We are enjoying the kingdom of God and we are walking in the highway of holiness where the unclean can never pass. The lions and the ravenous beasts represent those who are filled with wickedness and evil and they are excluded from this kingdom of peace and it is only for the ransomed of the Lord who come to Zion with songs and everlasting joy.

Would you like a scripture in the New Testament showing the fulfillment? Then listen to this from Titus 3 and beginning with verse 3, "For we ourselves also were sometimes foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving divers lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful, and hating one another. But after that the kindness and love of God our Saviour toward man appeared, Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us, by the washing of regeneration, and renewing of the Holy Ghost; Which he shed on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Saviour". Friends, have you been saved from your sin? Has the death of Christ been in vain for you? I am happy to be enjoying the privileges of the gospel and the peace that comes through the promised Messiah.

Now there is more provisions than just this. Did you notice in that prophecy over in Isa. that it mentioned about the eyes of the blind being opened and the ears of the deaf being unstopped and the lame man leaping as a hart, and the tongue of the dumb sing? Do you not remember the miracles that Christ performed with the bringing of the gospel? Do you recall how the lame man was healed by the side of the pool and how about the fellow who was born blind and had never seen? After Christ healed him the Jews thrust him out and

didn't want to accept his explanation of his healing. So the coming of the gospel brought with it also healing for the afflicted.

Listen to this prophecy from Isa. 53:5, "But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed." And here is the fulfillment in Matt. 8, verse 16 and 17, "When the even was come, they brought unto him many that were possessed with devils: and he cast out the spirits with his word, and healed all that were sick: That it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Esaias the prophet, saying, Himself took our infirmities, and bare our sicknesses." And then I like this scripture so well in Heb. 13:8, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever." Aren't you glad that Christ did establish his kingdom and that he is now reigning and will reign until all enemies will be put under him?

But along with these privileges come also obligations. It is our solemn duty and obligation to go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. If we are faithful we shall be rewarded and if not, how shall we stand in that great day when we shall give an account of the deeds which are done in the body? What sort of persons should we then be in all holy conversation and godliness. Where is our zeal for God? Are we concerned about the perishing nations who have not yet come to the knowledge of the truth. Multitudes are yet in darkness, either because they have not heard or accepted the truth. Let us haste with the water of life to quench the thirsting of those who are perishing without God. How shall we appear in that great day when the conquests of the lion of the tribe of Judah

are ended; when the mediatorial kingdom is delivered up unto the Father, and the Judge of quick and dead sets on the great white throne and we hear him say to those on his left hand "I was hungry and ye gave me no meat, I was thirsty and ye gave me no drink"? I say, how shall we appear if we have made no exertions to tell the lost nations of the earth the necessity for preparing to meet their God and showing them the means of doing it by affording them the blessings of the gospel of the grace of God. Let us beware lest the stone that struck the great image and dashed it to pieces fall on us and grind us to powder. No doubt many Bibles and much literature is sent out into heathen countries but how shall they hear without a preacher and how shall they understand the things which they read unless those who know the things of God teach them. Let us haste then and send missionaries and gospel workers with the Bibles that God may work mightily in the earth. Let us be workers together with him that we receive not the grace of God in vain. For "he that converteth a sinner from the error of his ways shall save a soul from death and hide a multitude of sins". It is true that God does not call everyone of us to be a missionary. He does not call everyone to bid farewell to all family ties and go to the heathen with the glad tidings of great joy, but he does loudly call on his church and the subjects of his kingdom to assist in sending those who can and will say "Here am I, send me". Let us be faithful in the new year of 1970.

And now, let us pray,

Our gracious Father,

We are glad for the dawning of a new year. We are glad for the coming of the Messiah and the peace and the king-

dom which shall never pass away. May we be faithful servants of thine each and every remaining day of our lives and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen
