## Pollution

Radio Broadcast for week of February 15, 1970 (See back page for list of stations.)

"These are wells without water, clouds that are carried with a tempest; to whom the mist of darkness is reserved for ever. For when they speak great swelling words of vanity, they allure through the lusts of the flesh, through much wantonness, those that were clean escaped from them who live in error. While they promise them liberty, they themselves are the servants of corruption; for of whom a man is overcome, of the same is he brought in bondage. For if after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning. For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them. But it is happened unto them according to the true proverb, The dog is turned to his own vomit again; and the sow that was washed to her wallowing in the mire." II Peter 2:17-22

Friends, we are living in a time when the word "pollution" is a very common one. We hear and read of the pollutions that are in the air. The factories put out great volumes of smoke, the automobiles and the diesel engines in the trucks send out their deadly fumes to pollute the air. Then, the streams are polluted in various ways. Garbage is thrown into them making them unsafe for drinking water. Sometimes the fish cannot even live in certain streams because they have been polluted. Some folks have very little respect for the parks and the highways. You can see the beer cans and the pop bottles which litter the roads. Papers are thrown into the streets and the parks. And so often we hear the word pollution. It is indeed time that we became concerned about the pollution of God's great and wonderful creation, the world in which we live.

But wait a moment. I want to read you one of these verses again, "For if after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning." I don't believe that this verse is speaking primarily about the pollution in the natural sense only. I believe we will have to go further than this to find the real source of trouble and I want to point out that cause to you. The pollution this verse refers to is the pollution that exists in the hearts and minds of the people that are alienated from God and there are plenty of folks like that in the world today. It is true that some of the first things I mentioned are a result of this basic trouble existing in the hearts of men and women. It is not the spending of large sums of money which is going to clean



up this pollution that I am speaking about. You cannot pass enough laws to correct the trouble. You cannot whitewash the outside and guarantee that the inward trouble will be gone. We must first get at the source of the real cause of this pollution. You see, this word pollution is not a new one. It has been existing a long time and God knows all about the pollution and what causes it and he knows the very source of pollution. I believe if the trouble is corrected at its very source many of our other problems will be easily corrected. Listen to the words of Jesus from Matt. 15 verses 18 and 19, "But those things which proceed out of the mouth come forth from the heart; and they defile the man. For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies".

What folks need today is a real awakening, a revival, and a turning away from their sins, coming to the Lord for cleansing, for salvation, that they may be made free from the pollution of their own hearts and thoughts.

Now the reason we know their hearts are polluted is because we see the evidence of it on the outside. Folks who indulge in strong drinks, gambling, dancing, pool-halls, beer parlors, and theaters become defiled and contaminated with the lusts, the revellings, and the abominable idolatries which the scriptures cry out against. The pollutions of the world are many and there is just one cure for these evils. The cursing and the filthy words will be stopped and their flow will cease to come out of the mouths of folks when the source has been corrected.

And another thing, 30 or 40 years ago so little was thought or known of the

dangers of powerful drugs which are so common in the world today. Oh, yes there was the drunkard on the street in skid row, but I want to tell you something. These drugs today are not confined to folks who live in the slums of our cities only. They reach into the homes of many classes, the poor and the rich alike. The use of drugs has become a plague to our nation and to many young people who are exposed to their character-ruining, mind-warping, lust-appealing sensual, fleshly desires which drown men in destruction and perdition. And the thing which is so tragic about it all is that boys and girls even in their youth indulge in these things with very little restraint often from their own parents at home. No wonder crime is so prevalent and another thing, the TV screen is filling many a young mind and immature person with trash which pollute their hearts. Parents, wake up, find out to your own sorrow what is taking place in our nation. Young people, save yourself from the deadly evils of these polluting things.

And now I want to especially thank Sis. Grace Jones of Klamath Falls, Ore. and Sis. Dinkins of Senath, Mo., both of whom sent me a copy of this poem, "Guided men". I have made some changes in the poem, but here it is:

### Guided Men

Our Father up in heaven,  
Hear this humble prayer.  
May the people of all nations  
Be united in their care.

For earth's peace and man's  
salvation  
Can come only by His grace  
And not through bombs and missiles

Let us pray,

Our gracious heavenly Father,  
We desire to be guided by thy spirit  
and we want you to keep us free from  
the pollution of the world. Live in our  
hearts, as an example of what God's

grace and power can do. Bless each  
listener of the broadcast today and  
should there be those who find them-  
selves far from thee because of the  
pollutions of their own heart, bring  
them to repentance and satisfy them  
with thy salvation for we ask it in Jesus  
name. Amen

In the soul that answers the call for me.

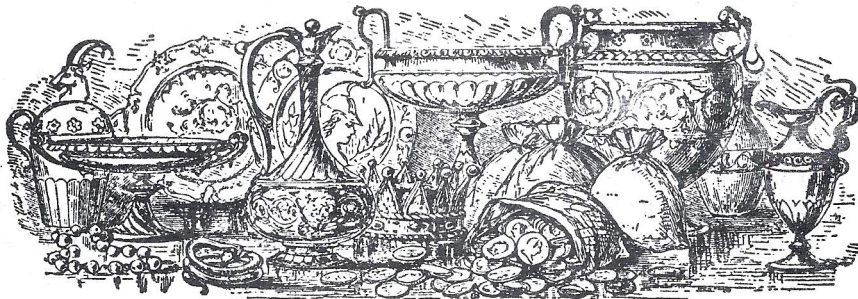
Shall the great Judge learn, when my task is through

That all I had worked for, I had left behind!



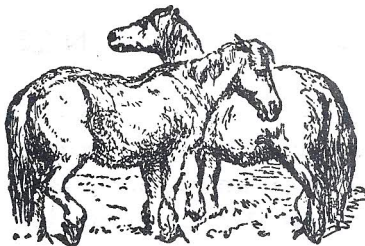
