The People of God

Radio Broadcast for week of April 12, 1970. (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends, it is indeed a pleasure and a privilege to be coming your way again. We hope today finds you encouraged in the Lord. I have some of the word of the Lord to bring you and since the word of God is forever settled in heaven and it is the word which shall judge us in the last day, then I am concerned about what it has to say, aren't you? Everyone should be. It tells us from whence we came and also points to the destiny of both saints and sinners. It is of great encouragement to those who love God because they are his people and he is their god.

Then listen to the 9th and 10th verses of the second chapter of I Peter. "But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light: Which in time past were not a people, but are now the people of God: which had not obtained mercy, but now have obtained mercy." Did you notice that it said, "Ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people"? Now God's people are something special. They are not just the ordinary run of folks in every day life but they have been called to walk a straight and narrow path and they are a chosen people of God. There is a verse in Eph. 1:4 which also brings this out. Listen, "According as he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love".

Sometimes there are salesmen who seek to induce others to buy their pro-

ducts and they'll approach the prospective customer with something free of charge or they might even say, "Congratulations, you have just won a pop toaster!" Or it might be something else of similar value. So the customer thinking that this is going to be free and without cost becomes overjoyed and elated. But often by the time he pays the handling charge, the postage, and various other expenses attached to this "free" gift he finds that he pays for it rather dearly. So after all, it is the manufacturer or salesman who profits from such a transaction.

Now I am not here to tell you that living a godly, saintly, holy life is the easiest thing in the world. There are going to be some trials, some persecutions, and some opposition, and you may as well be prepared for it. To think otherwise would be out of line with the teachings of the scripture. Listen to these emphatic words of Jesus, "And Jesus answered and said, Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or brethren, or sisters, or

father, or mother, or wife, or children, or lands, for my sake, and the gospel's, But he shall receive an hundredfold now in this time, houses, and brethren, and sisters, and mothers, and children, and lands, with persecutions; and in the world to come eternal life." Mark 10:29 30 But I am glad to tell you that I believe the reward of a godly life will be worth all that it ever costs us in this world. Listen to what the book of Eph. says about the people of God, "That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish." That is found in Eph. 5:27. Do you think that is putting the standard too high?

In Titus the 2nd chapter and beginning with the 11th verse we find this: "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation hath appeared to all men, Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works."

Now another thing about the Lord's people, they are walking in the light. That means they are living according to the knowledge and understanding which God has given them. When a person understands more, he is responsible for more. The more one learns and knows about the things of the Lord, the more he is responsible for doing them. You see there are a lot of folks who know much more than what they are really doing. Then these folks are not walking in the light. They are walking

in darkness and will be held accountable for such light. But as the scripture says, "But the path of the just is as the shining light that shineth more and more unto the perfect day". So the more we seek to know and do God's will, the brighter the way becomes. I John 2 and beginning with verse 4 puts it this way, "He that saith, I know him, and keepeth not his commandments, is a liar, and the truth is not in him. But whoso keepeth his word, in him verily is the love of God perfected: hereby know we that we are in him. He that saith he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked." And then going on down to begin with verse 9 listen to this, "He that saith he is in the light, and hateth his brother, is in darkness even until now. He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him. But he that hateth his brother is in darkness, and walketh in darkness, and knoweth not whither he goeth, because that darkness hath blinded his eyes."

Now I don't mean that everybody who pretends to serve the Lord is accepted of him. There are some folks who draw near to the Lord with their mouth, but their heart is a long way from him. Ezekiel brings this out in the 33rd chapter and verse 31, "And they come unto thee as the people cometh, and they sit before thee as my people, and they hear thy words, but they will not do them: for with their mouth they shew much love, but their heart goeth after their covetousness."

Then again Isaiah strikes close to the way some folks live these days, when he said, "Wherefore the Lord said, Forasmuch as this people draw near me with their mouth, and with their lips do honour me, but have removed

their heart far from me, and their fear toward me is taught by the precept of men". Isa. 29:13 And Jesus summed it up when he was talking to the hypocrites of his day in this way, "He answered and said unto them, Well hath Esaias prophesied of you hypocrites, as it is written, This people honoureth me with their lips, but their heart is far from me. Howbeit in vain do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men." Mark 7:6, 7

So, friends, it is not in word only that we serve God. It must be by our life and our actions, our relationship at home, among our friends, and even toward our enemies. We must show love if we would be the children of God. Listen to this poem:

There's A Way

There's a way that no fowl knoweth
And no vulture's eye hath seen;
Over it no lion goeth,
Neither passeth ought unclean.

There's a way where weary mortals
Find release from sin and strife;
'Tis a way that's everlasting,
Blessed way and truth and life.

There's a way that's straight and
narrow,
Where we walk by simple faith,
Even through the midst of trouble
And the shadowy vale of death.

'Tis a way beside still waters,
Where are found the paths of peace,
Where we rest amid green pastures,
And our sighs and sorrows cease.

There's a way, and walk ye in it
Meekly, humbly with thy God;
They shall run and not be weary,
That are hid with Christ in God.

Let us pray,

Our father in heaven,

Bless the words of the message to the hearts of every listener. May it be an encouragement to the saved as they continue to walk in the light. Cause the Holy Spirit to bring deep conviction upon those who are separated from God because of their sins and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen

From Okla.: "I want to tell how the Lord protected us from death in an automobile accident. In January I went to make some errands one night. I had gone and picked up my cousin, Oleta Wright, who was about 18 years old and had gotten my brother Raymond's baby girl (6 months old). On our way to another girl's house we came to an uncontrolled intersection and was hit by a car that was going at a tremendous speed. (I estimated about 90 or 100 but didn't know exactly) We were hit on the right front side of the car then somehow he hit us in 3 other places, along that side and in the front of the car also. Somehow the car ended up in the opposite direction from which it was going. . . I thought at first that the car was on fire because I saw something below me that looked like a little fire. When the car finally stopped my cousin began to call to me that she was caught and to get her loose. Well, at first I couldn't get myself together and couldn't figure out what was caught (whether it was her head or something else) finally she told me to get her hand out of the door. Then I reached over her and tried to open the door and (by the great mercy of God) it came open. This was the side of the car that was hit and the door must have bent inward and caught her hand. Then after I realized she was free and in fair condition I proceeded to see if the baby was still alive. She had been knocked face downward and her cover was over her but my cousin Oleta had held to her all the time (which was another miracle) and had slightly fallen on her. I moved my cousin off of her and picked her up and found that she was still alive and that she only had one speck of blood on her about the size of a pin scratch. . . (Thank the Lord!) Then someone came to the car and I handed them the baby and they layed her on the grass. I crawled over

my cousin and got out. We discovered that the noise we heard was that the car had been knocked upside down and landed on its top. The thing that looked like fire was the light in the top of the car. . . We were taken to the hospital. I was not hurt seriously. . . The baby and my cousin were examined. . . They checked her slightly and they x-rayed my cousin. We were all released. The car was a total loss because the frame of it had been ruined. . . Some marvelled that we came out alive. . . Well I will close for now but would like to say that the Lord impressed me to pray just before I left sister Burke's to go do the errands and while I was praying I thanked the Lord for how he had protected me over the dangerous streets. Then it seems He overshadowed me and made me realize while I was yet praying how He had really protected me over the streets. I don't know the depth of what the accident means but I do know that with my own eyes I have seen a miracle. . . I hope this may be a help to someone else. . . It certainly has been a real blessing to me. Pray for me."
