## *"...in spirit and in truth"*

Radio Broadcast for week of April 26, 1970 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. I count it a privilege to be coming your way once again by means of radio, bringing you the unsearchable riches of Christ. Did you ever stop to think how valuable are the things which we don't even see with our natural eyes? One verse of scripture says, "While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal." II Cor. 4:18 So I hope that you will take a few moments' time to consider some of these things which are not seen. Of course they are eternal things and will never pass away.

I have been enjoying these nice days of sunshine which we have had. There is something about springtime which gives one a sense of the creation of God coming to life again. It is invigorating.

Now I would like to take your minds back to the days of Jesus when he went about doing good, healing those that were oppressed of the devil, and his disciples saw the wonderful miracles which he did. One day as he walked along in Samaria he came to a certain city called Sychar. Now this city was near the piece of ground that Jacob had given to Joseph and there was a well on it known as Jacob's well. It was about the noon hour and Jesus was weary so he just sat there on the well. I suspect that a good drink of cool water would have been refreshing to him too. In the meantime his disciples had gone into the city to get something to eat. Now while they were gone and Jesus was resting there at the well there came a Samaritan woman to draw water and from the conversation which followed Jesus spoke forth the truth there

that has been a blessing to the many generations which have followed. Among other things he told her this, "God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth." You see, she wanted to know just what he did believe about worshipping God and how one should go about it and he just let her know that the ones who really pleased God were the ones that worshiped him in the right way which is in the spirit and in the truth. It doesn't make so much difference where you maybe, you may be in the country, you may be at home, on land, or on sea. It is not the geographical location which matters, but it is the manner in which you come: in the spirit and in the truth. Any other way that people endeavor to come to God is wrong and there is just one true way to worship him. It matters not how fine and elaborate the building may be, it matters not how eloquent the preacher is, it matters not the wealth that the people have. One might have all of these things and still not find favor with God.



Now take a look at the Pharisee who went up to the temple to pray. He was a good moral man. He had many good things about him. In fact, most of his habits were good ones. He gave tithes and he fasted twice in a week and he prayed, but God looked down at this man's spirit and he saw that he had an arrogant and a proud spirit. Listen to this verse, "Though the Lord be high, yet hath he respect unto the lowly: but the proud he knoweth afar off." Psa. 138:6 And again in James 4:6 we find these words, "Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble." So you see, folks, one must have the true spirit of God in order to please him. Genuine salvation does something for folks. It will bring down the high and the mighty and give them a humble spirit before God and it will take the people who are in the slums of sin and wickedness and it will lift them up out of these places. It will make clean folks out of filthy ones.

But don't forget the other part of this verse. You must seek the Lord not only with the right spirit but you must have the truth with it. There is such a thing as being deceived. Folks can believe a lie so long until they really think it is the truth. But it isn't. It doesn't matter how long you may believe it. If it isn't the truth it doesn't make it so. Some folks substitute doctrines and commandments of men for the true teaching of God but that doesn't make it so. They need to know the truth for it is the truth which makes men free. Listen to these immortal words of the saviour, "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." John 14:6 Friends, there are many false spirits which are gone out into the world today. There are many

deceivers who are leading thousands of souls away from the truth. Search the scriptures for in them ye think ye have eternal life and it is the scriptures which testify of the Lord who is the way, the truth, and the life.

We are glad for the spirit of God and the truth of thy word. Help us to abide in the truth and worship thee in the spirit. We especially pray for each listener of the broadcast and ask that you may guide and bless them through Christ our Lord. Amen
