"Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things." Phil. 4:8 Friends, I hope today that your thoughts are good thoughts, clean ones, and pure, for indeed one is greatly affected by the thoughts which they think. If these are good thoughts one is made better. If their thoughts are wicked, and evil, it merely shows what is in their heart. Listen to this poem:

Jesus surely knew what he was talking about when he taught his disciples to pray "lead us not into temptation". You see, there are many opportunities to do wrong. If you are seeking to be crooked and to committ evil, you'll find plenty of opportunities to do it, and sometimes those opporrtunities will come at a time when you are least expecting them. Now, the way to overcome temptation is to do as one scripture says, "Gird up the loins of your minds". If you allow your thoughts to dwell on things which are not good you'll surely be affected by them. So, do like this scripture says, "Gird up the loins of your minds". Do you know the gateway by which evil thoughts get into the heart? They go through the mind. Alright, that is why it is so important that we keep the gate bolted and fortified against the powers of evil.

Notice a few of the things this verse says to think about. It mentions the true, the honest, and the just, as well as the pure, the lovely, and whatsoever things are of good report. Now you

just show me a person who thinks on things like this and I'll show you a person who is guarding the entrance of their heart to keep evil thoughts out of their minds.

Take for instance the example which Jesus left. After he had fasted for 40 days and nights he was hungry. Then Satan came and suggested that he turn the stones into bread. Well, that certainly was within his power to do, but if he had looked longingly at the stone and imagined how good the bread would taste, he might have yielded to the suggestion of Satan. But once a person recognizes that a thing is wrong, he should harbor it no longer. It is time to let one's thoughts move on to greater heights. The object of this lesson recommends holiness and righteousness to the followers of Christ in every point of view. It shows that we are required to have the mind that was in Christ and to walk even as he walked. We are not to attend to one branch of righteousness or virtue only, but to everything by which we might bring honor to God, good to our fellowmen, and exemplify the life of Christ.

I don't want you to forget that part of the verse which says, "Think on these things". In other words, think on the good things and it will make your life better and more enriched.

Listen to this verse, "Unto the pure all things are pure; but unto them that are defiled and unbelieving is nothing pure; but even their mind and conscience is defiled." Titus 1:15 Now do you want your mind and conscience to be clean? Then guard your mind and don't allow it to run away. In the book of James a very accurate account is given concerning temptation. It says that every man is tempted when he is drawn

away of his own lust. Now what is it that will draw one away into temptation? I would say the senses of the body. It might either be the eye, or the smelling, the hearing, the tasting, or feeling. Would you like to know why so many women folks are being attacked on the streets these days? Well, let me give you one good reason. It is the way they are dressed. I say that a miniskirt is a reproach to anyone professing to be a child of God and pretending to follow in his footsteps. If you want to be treated as a lady, then dress like one, act like one, and think like one. And the same thing goes for the men too. They need to gird up the loins of their minds and watch and be sober.

Do you remember that song, "Palms of victory"? There is one verse that says,

"The songsters in the arbor
That stood beside the way
Attracted his attention,
Inviting his delay:
His watch-word being 'Onward!'
He stopped his ears and ran,
Still shouting as he journeyed,
'Deliverance will come.'"

Friends, for you to live a clean and a holy life it may be necessary for you to do like the illustration of the monkeys. One had his hands over his eyes, another had his hands over his mouth, and one had his hands over his ears, indicating that they see no evil, speak no evil, and hear no evil. Well, I realize that we are in a world where there are many folks not living this way and we come in contact with this type of people. It doesn't mean that we are ignorant and that we don't know what is being done, but we should at least be like Jesus prayed for his disciples when he said, "They are not of the world

even as I am not of the world". And he prayed for the father to keep them from the evil. This we need to do continually.

Now I want to go back and pick up one more verse from Phil. This is the 7th verse of this 4th chapter, "And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." I am sure glad that it is possible for the peace of God to keep our hearts and minds through Christ. I believe that the Lord is able to keep them as a strong place or castle. Here the heart is mentioned, which is the seat of your affections and passion, and then it mentions the mind which is your understanding, judgment, and conscience. All of these need to be kept through Christ Jesus. It is through Christ that we were brought into this state of favor and it is through him that we are preserved in it. Dear ones, Christ is able to keep the heart in peace in which he dwells and rules. This peace passes all understanding. It is of a very different nature from all that can arise from human occurrences. It is the peace which Christ has purchased and which God dispenses. It is felt by all the true godly folks and can be explained by none. It is communion with the father and his son, Jesus Christ, by the power and influence of the Holy Ghost.

We are glad for the peace of God which passeth all understanding and we pray that you would keep our hearts and minds through our Lord free from the condemnation and the reproach of Satan. Bless each listener of the broadcast this day that they too may share in the peace of God and thine shall be
