## Obedience

Radio Broadcast for week of May 17, 1970 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. "And Samuel said, Hath the Lord as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the Lord? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams. For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry. Because thou hast rejected the word of the Lord, he hath also rejected thee from being king." I Samuel 15:22, 23

It seems that we've reached an age and era, when disobedience is very prevalent. These verses which I have just given you are the words of Samuel to King Saul after he had failed to carry out the commandments of the Lord. When Saul was first made king he was quite shy and unassuming but now look at him, if you will. Headstrong and haughty, taking things into his own hands without consulting the Lord. Saul had miserably failed in the task which God had given him to do. Then of course he made excuses. He said it was because of the people but the pride of his own heart had lifted him up to a place of disobedience.

Isn't this true of the times in which we live. Some children do not want to obey their parents. Many of them refuse to obey their school teachers. Often young folks do not want to listen to their elders, but they go headstrong in their own ways and by the same token this is the example which is set by many of the citizens of our country. They don't want to obey the rules and regulations of society. They regard not the life and property of others, to

the extent which they should, and in general there is just a spirit of disobedience prevailing all too often. I am glad this isn't true altogether. There are still some god-fearing people and some children who respect their parents and some citizens who are above reproach. But there is one thing we must all learn if we would please God and that is obedience. Some folks can just offer a lot of excuses why they don't obey and often it appears that their arguments are reasonable but Saul's arguments didn't stand before Samuel. Samuel went on to say, "Stay, and I will tell thee what the Lord hath said to me this night. And he said unto him, Say on. And Samuel said, When thou wast little in thine own sight, wast thou not made the head of the tribes of Israel, and the Lord anointed thee king over Israel?"

Do you remember the trouble that Jonah had? Do you know why he was in trouble? Well, let me tell you. It was because he refused to obey what God told him to do. The word of the Lord had come unto Jonah and told him to go unto Nineveh. You see, Nineveh was a large

city and a very wicked one. The Lord told him to go down there and preach the preaching I bid thee. Now I don't know why Jonah didn't want to go. He might have been afraid of the people. He might have thought it wouldn't do any good. But instead of going to Nineveh he took a ship headed for Tarshish. Well, that is where the trouble began. God dealt with Jonah and he had mercy upon him. But there was no way to successfully avoid doing what God had told him to do and after Jonah was cast out on land once again from the belly of the whale, the word of the Lord came unto Jonah the second time, arise and go unto Nineveh and preach unto them the preaching that I bid thee. Well, that lesson was enough for Jonah and he obeyed the voice of the Lord. Dear ones, what God wants is obedience. If the Lord has given you a job to do, you would do well to be at it.

Take for example Saul of Tarsus. He thought he ought to do many things contrary to the doctrine of Christ and persecuted the early disciples. But one day the Lord stopped him and gave him some orders and after he realized that he was persecuting Jesus of Nazareth he said, "What wilt thou have me to do?" And of course in the meantime he was blind and had to have some one lead him by the hand, but he became obedient from that moment on. Listen to this verse from Deut. 13:4. It says, "Ye shall walk after the Lord your God, and fear him, and keep his commandments, and obey his voice, and ye shall serve him, and cleave unto him."

Now there may be someone who will hear this broadcast who simply thinks, "I don't want to live that way, and no body is going to make me do what I don't want to do." Friends, how true

this is to a great extent. You don't have to be saved, you don't have to live for the Lord. It is like this poem which says,

### YOUR CHOICE

You don't have to go to heaven,  
You don't have to live for God,  
You don't have to be forgiven,  
Nor washed in Jesus' blood.

When beyond the shining portals  
All the ransomed meet at last,  
You don't have to be among them  
When the fight on earth is passed.

Though the Saviour died on Calvary,  
Still His pardon you need not know;  
Though His Spirit now is striving,  
To the Lord you need not go.

Though a mother in her sorrow  
For your soul doth plead and pray.  
You don't have to be forgiven,  
Need not walk the narrow way.

Though you choose the path of sorrow,  
Live the life that suits you best,  
Turn your back on Heavenly treasure  
Vainly seek for peace and rest,

God will never make you serve Him,  
Never force you to be saved;  
You can go to judgment Christless,  
Though your path with prayer is paved.

You can keep right on your sinning,  
Turn your back on what is right,  
Push headlong in perdition,  
And an endless awful night.

There's no power in earth or Heaven  
That can check your downward way  
Unless Jesus Blood is sprinkled  
And your sins are washed away.



I say it is time that folks should listen to the word of God. Jer. 26:13 puts it this way, "Therefore now amend your ways and your doings, and obey the voice of the Lord your God; and the Lord will repent him of the evil that he hath pronounced against you." You see, you don't have to obey but the immutable law of God says, "Be not deceived, God is not mocked; for whatsoever a man soweth that shall he also reap." You can go on and reap the wages of sin if that is what you choose. But dear ones, remember the wages of sin is death but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. Our obedience to him should be constant without reserve and willing. Isa. 1:19 says, "If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land".

Friends, the only way to happiness is through obedience. Noah obeyed God and built an ark to the saving of his household. Abraham obeyed God and went out by faith not knowing whether he went, but God blessed him and made of him a great nation, and through him God has blessed the entire world. It is written of Hezekiah, "For he clave to the Lord, and departed not from following him, but kept his commandments, which the Lord commanded Moses." And one time when the disciples were suffering persecution from the people "Then Peter and the other apostles answered and said, We ought to obey God rather than men." And I say that we ought to obey God too. But it is left to each individual to make his choice. Remember God is not going to force you to do right, but I believe if you will do it of your own will you'll be happy that you did.

Let us pray, Our Father,  
Bless each listener of the broadcast.

Give us a willing heart to obey. Remove stubbornness and hatred from the life of each one who has a yearning heart to do thy will and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen
