## Past, Present and Future *Aug 18-74*

Radio Broadcast for week of June 21, 1970 (See back page for list of stations.)

We are living in a time when there are many things to occupy our thoughts, our time and efforts. There are lots of things to worry us, if we would allow them to do so. There is much tension around us. Amidst it all here is a comforting scripture for us to remember. Listen, it says, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever." Heb. 13:8 There are some things in this scripture worth noticing. First, it shows the eternal existence of Jesus, the son of God. He existed with God the father long before the world was ever created, and he still lives in our day, right now. There is no beginning or ending of God. He is from everlasting to everlasting and when these temporal and earthly things which we see now have all passed away, God will still be the same.

If we could erase from our minds the worries of the past and cast aside the fears of the future, we would be in a better condition to accomplish more at this present moment. After all, today is all that we have. Yesterday is gone for ever. We cannot recall it. Our mistakes and our failures of the past are behind us. Let us keep them that way. Let us not worry over the past. If the past is continually troubling you, let me tell you what you do. First of all make sure that the past is under the blood. Forgiveness of sins is possible through Christ. Once they are forgiven they are no longer held against us. Listen to this scripture, "Who is a God like unto thee, that pardoneth iniquity, and passeth by the transgression of the remnant of his heritage? he retaineth not his anger for ever, because he delighteth in mercy. He will turn again, he will have compassion upon us; he will subdue our iniquities; and thou wilt cast all their sins into the depths of the

sea." Mich. 7:18, 19 Do you know it is rather hard to locate something which has been cast into the depths of the sea? There are many folks that would like to have the treasures of ancient ships which sank to the bottom of the sea, but it is a rather hard thing to locate and recover them. Well, I am glad that my sins are cast from me and I would be glad to have them as far away as in the depths of the sea, not to trouble me anymore. Wouldn't you?

However there is one thing you might do about the past which would help. It may require some restitution on your part. If you have stolen or cheated, go and make it right, repay it. Once this is done and your sins are under the blood of Christ, say like the Apostle Paul, "Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize



of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." Phil. 3:13-14

Don't live in the past, live in the present. We can not recall the mistakes and the failures of yesterday and we cannot cross the bridges of tomorrow until we get there. When God's people came to the shores of the Red Sea there seemed to be no way to cross. Behind them were the Egyptians with their armour and there seemed to be no escape, there was the sea before them. But do you remember what God told the people through Moses? "Fear ye not, stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord, which he will shew to you to day: for the Egyptians whom ye have seen to day, ye shall see them again no more for ever. The Lord shall fight for you, and ye shall hold your peace." Ex. 14:13, 14 Please notice that he said, "which he will shew to you to day". Now he didn't say that they had known about it before or that it would happen in some far distant future event, but he said "to day". Oh, if we could live only for today. The future is so uncertain and the enemy often causes folks to spend their time worrying about the future. Dear ones, you can not live tomorrow until tomorrow comes. Let us live today, let us be up and doing what we can. Listen to these comforting words which Jesus spoke, "Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof." Matt. 6:34 And so often the things which trouble us concerning the future never really happen after all. They are just dark shadows which are dispelled by the light of heaven as we go forward. Do you remember that scripture which says, "But the path of the just is as the shining light, that shineth more and more unto the perfect day"? Prov. 4:18

Now, if you are not walking in the path of the just there is plenty of things for you to be concerned about. The future is not bright before you and the hope of tomorrow has many forebodings. What you need is a guide to lead you right. You need a saviour to forgive the sins of the past and to direct your steps in the future in the right way. Listen to this poem!
