The Remnant Part 2

Radio Broadcast for week of November 1, 1970 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. A cheerful greeting to each and every listener of the broadcast. We are deeply grateful for the opportunity of bringing you once again the message from the Word of the Lord. If you remember last week I spoke on "the remnant". I used this particularly in reference to the people of God and even though they are scattered often times by the boundaries of land and sea, yet God's people are joined together with a unity which molds them into one.

Now this scripture which Isaiah, the gospel prophet, gave as he forsaw a vision of the people of God. In Isa. 62 and beginning with verse 10, listen, "Go through, go through the gates; prepare ye the way of the people; cast up, cast up the highway; gather out the stones; lift up a standard for the people. Behold, the Lord hath proclaimed unto the end of the world, Say ye to the daughter of Zion, Behold, thy salvation cometh; behold, his reward is with him, and his work before him. And they shall call them, The holy people, The redeemed of the Lord: and thou shalt be called, Sought out, A city not forsaken. " Notice from this scripture that it speaks about a highway. I believe this refers to the highway of holiness. It means that God's people are separate from the world and are not mixed up in evil things. In fact, the 12th verse brings this out when it says, "The holy people, The redeemed of the Lord: and thou shalt be called, Sought out, A city not forsaken. "This is the kind of a church which Christ set up and this is still the only kind which he acknowledges, a church which is clean even though the number may

be small. Yet it is quality which the Lord is looking for and not quantity.

Notice how closely this scripture in Isa. ties in with Zech. 9:9, "Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion; shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, thy King cometh unto thee: he is just, and having salvation; lowly, and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt the foal of an ass." This was a direct prophesy of Jesus.

Here then is its fulfillment in Matt. 21 beginning with verse 4, "All this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying, Tell ye the daughter of Sion, Behold, thy King cometh unto thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of an ass. And the disciples went, and did as Jesus commanded them, And brought the ass, and the colt, and put on them their clothes, and they set him thereon. And a very great multitude spread their garments in the way; others cut down branches from the trees, and strawed them in the way."

Dear ones, it was a wonderful thing

when Jesus brought salvation through his life, death, and resurrection. It was a glorious day when the Holy Ghost fell upon the disciples assembled on the day of Pentecost. It was marvelous how God added to the church about 3,000 souls after that unforgettable sermon which Peter preached. Then it says that the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved. That was simply wonderful.

But, let us look again and see how the church of the morning time began to decline and fall away. Grievous wolves entered in not sparing the flock, even as the Apostle Paul warned. was only a small remnant remaining as the truth of God's church was obscured by papal night. But then again according to prophesy God brought forth the truth in this evening time. Little by little did the reformers such as John Huss, Martin Luther, and the Wesleys begin to understand that justification came by faith, that sanctification was a second definite work of grace wrought in the hearts by the cleansing of inbred sin and the infilling of the Holy Ghost. But with the coming of more truth, Satanalso appeared with his cunning craftiness. Men began to organize themselves into so called church groups which forbid the Holy Spirit to have right of way. Instead of Holy Ghost leadership manrule was put in its place.

But God was still working and under the preaching of such men as D. S. Warner, B. E. Warren, H. M. Riggle a few years before 1900, they declared (and of course some years after that) they declared how that God's church is a called out people, separate from sectarian groups. A verse of song describes so well what they stood for. It says:

"The Bible is our rule of faith,
And Christ alone is Lord,
All we are equal in his sight,
When we obey his word,
No earthly master do we know,
To manrule will not bow,
But to each other and to God
Eternal trueness vow."

Dear ones, here are the guidelines for God's true church, the holy remnant. They accept the Bible as the divine inspired Word of God. Their lives conform to its teaching. There is harmony and unity. In Isa. 32 and beginning with verse 37 we find, "Behold, I will gather them out of all countries, whither I have driven them in mine anger, and in my fury, and in great wrath; and I will bring them again unto this place, and I will cause them to dwell safely: And they shall be my people, and I will be their God: And I will give them one heart, and one way, that they may fear me for ever, for the good of them, and of their children after them: And I will make an everlasting covenant with them, that I will not turn away from them, to do them good; but I will put my fear in their hearts, that they shall not depart from me. " Now, this brings us down to the present day. Let me say there are many who have fallen away from the true teachings of the Bible but I believe that God still has a church and a people who love him supremely.

Listen to these verses beginning with Isa. 35:8, "And an highway shall be there, and a way, and it shall be called The way of holiness; the unclean shall not pass over it; but it shall be for those: the wayfaring men; though fools, shall not err therein. No lion shall be there, nor any ravenous beast shall go up thereon, it shall not be found there; but the redeemed shall walk there: And the ransomed of the Lord

shall return, and come to Zion with songs and everlasting joy upon their heads: they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away." Now I don't believe that's speaking about a highway such as our Interstate highway system. This is speaking about the plan of salvation, the way of holiness and righteousness and it refers to the remnant of God's people who are saved from worldly things and the things of sin and evil. It's speaking about God's people.

Listen to this poem:

Fair Zion

O beautiful Zion, fair bride of the Lamb!

Thy marvelous light we behold, Which shone on the nations enshrouded by darkness,

And millions were brought to thy fold.

Eclipsed was thy luster by long papal night,

And dimly the dark, cloudy day Revealed thee to eyes that were earnestly searching For truth and the heavenly way.

Thy light as the morning breaks forth in the earth:

Thy brightness all nations shall see: The ransomed from Babel are eagerly turning

With songs of rejoicing to thee.

Eternity's ages of bliss shall be thine,

In regions unclouded above; And there shalt thou dwell evermore with thy Maker,

Delighting thyself in his love.

Let us pray,

Our Father,

Bless the words of the message to the good of every listener. May they not return unto thee void but cause the truth to spread and break down every barrier in the hearts of those who would resist thee. Remember each listener. Bless them in the way which they need most and to thee we will give the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen


