Spiritual Blindness

Radio Broadcast for week of January 3, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

"Therefore seeing we have this ministry, as we have received mercy, we faint not: But have renounced the hidden things of dishonesty, not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully; but by manifestation of the truth commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God. But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost: In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them. For we preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord; and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God, and not of us. " II Cor. 4:1-7

In counting your blessings have you ever thought what it was worth to you to have the five senses of sight, hearing, tasting, smelling, and feeling? It is worth a lot, isn't it? But I am particularly thinking of the blessing of eyesight. With our eyes we see the things about us from day to day. see how to dress and how to eat. Our eyes help us to stay on the sidewalk when we are walking down the street. It is by their use that we avoid accidents while driving on the highway. Of course sometimes folks aren't looking carefully enough and do get into trouble. Did you ever hear the expression, "Watch where you are going"? Well, now let me show you something. Eyesight is given to us for a purpose and it is a great blessing. Think how we would have to adjust ourselves to living if we were totally blind. Of course there are those who do it and I admire But I will say this, it them for it.

must no doubt be quite oppressing when one first learns that they are blind or that they are going to be blind.

But spiritual blindness is far worse than being blinded in a natural sense. There are a lot of folks blinded in a spiritual way. They don't see the working of God in their life. They are ignorant of what God can and does do for them. And sometimes folks are willingly ignorant of this. It is their own choice. One time Jesus said when speaking about the hypocrites of his day, "Let them alone: they be blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch." Matt. 15:14 But before I get too far away from it, I want you to especially notice this 3rd verse. and the 4th one too, of the 4th chapter of II Cor.: "But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost: In whom the god of this world hath blinded the the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, what disable a person for a few mowho is the image of God, should shine unto them. "

Now, let me tell you that Satan is an expert in blinding folks. Sometimes he even does it through a cloak of religion, under the pretense of righteousness. Let me illustrate it this way. On a recent news broadcast I heard of a fellow who went into a jewelry store. You know sometimes thieves make quite a pretense anyway. But of course I don't know really what sort of a scheme this fellow put up, but it seems that he got in his possession a bag of very valuable jewels. You see diamonds are quite valuable. Well, this fellow got hold of a whole bag of them and out The jewelry man the door he went. didn't want to see that fellow run off with those diamonds and not do something about it, so he did the natural thing which one would do -- take out after the thief. So down the street they went. Others along the way, seeing the commotion and realizing that there was a man they needed to catch, joined in the It so happened that the thief was dropping diamonds all along as he went. So the folks coming behind began gathering up those diamonds while others were in hot pursuit. Finally, it seemed that they were about to close in on him and catch him. So what did he do? He sprayed a certain chemical similiar to tear gas on those in pursuit. By this time or shortly thereafter a policeman had also joined in the chase so they finally did capture the man, take away from him the remaining diamonds, and of course he was put I am not very familiar with in jail. this form of tear gas "Mace" which I believe the fellow used, but in order to speak more intelligently about it, I did call a local police officer on the

He was actually a thief, but in order to get away with the diamonds he would even create at least temporary blindness, if possible. But did you know that Satan has blinded. the minds and hearts of a lot of people today in order that he may capture their souls? And furthermore he is being very successful at it. I believe the blazing light of the gospel will uncover Satan and his schemes. the unregenerate, those who have an evil heart, and those who are wicked who are blinded by Satan's schemes.

> Listen to these verses from Matt. 6: 22-23. "The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light. But if thine eye be evil, thy whole body shall be full of darkness. If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness!" Then here are some more verses in I John 1:6, 7, "If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth: But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin. " Friends, there is just no way for you to have your spiritual eyesight clear and unobstructed only through the blood of Christ. It is then that you can say like the man who had been blind, "one thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see. " John 9:25 And now this poem:

DELIVERANCE FROM BLINDNESS

Blind, totally blind! No more to view a loved one's face; No more behold a form of grace

Nor see the little children gay
In childish glee about their play;
No more the tuneful birds to see
As quick they flit from tree to tree;

Balm, Gilead's balm!
The Lord that caused the scales to fall
From off the blinded eyes of Paul
Would cause thine own dim eyes to see
His precious promises to thee;
Thy deafened ears he'll cause to hear
That voice which speaks thy heart to cheer.

Then, look to him, of sin repent; For unto thee his Son was sent, And on the cross his blood was spilt To save thee from thy sin and guilt Then open thine eyes, his mercy see; Oh, hear! his promise is for thee!


