Now that the Christmas season has come and gone and we are entering upon a new year I hope that we will not forget the lessons that we have learned throughout the year 1970. May the experiences of the past strengthen us for the days and months ahead. Now just as the angel announced the birth of our Lord when he said, "behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy, which shall be to all people", even so I am glad that I have the privilege of bringing to you some "good news". And that is what I want to talk about on this broadcast. You like to hear good news, don't you? But first this poem:

Now, are you ready for the good news? Then listen to this scripture, "As cold waters to a thirsty soul, so is good news from a far country". Prov. 25: 25 Now, the good news is this: Even though at one time we were separated from God because of our sins, the Lord made a way whereby we could walk with him again. What is more beautiful than walking hand in hand with our Creator? But before we can enjoy to the fullest extent a good cold drink of water we must know what it is to be In Matt. 5 and verse 6 we thirsty. find these words, "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled. " It

is only natural for us to have alonging to know more of God and his plan for us. And as we long to know his will and to do it, he is faithful to reveal his will to us. So do you know what is often their number one problem? It is a drink of fresh water. Sometimes they will take their clothing and catch the rain water and wring it out to have a drink of fresh water. Here is a verse which fits in real well at this point. It says, "As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God. " Psa. 42:1

So the good news is, if you are disappointed and downcast there is a way out for you and that is through the saviour, Jesus Christ, who was born almost 2,000 years ago and the angels made the announcement of the glad tidings to the shepherds on the hillsides.

Then there was some more good news. An angel also gave the wonderful tidings of the resurection of Christ from the tomb, which of course was made to Mary Magdalene and the other Mary who had come early in the morning to the sepulchre. "And they departed

quickly from the sepulchre with fear and great joy; and did run to bring his disciples word. " Now don't you know that was some good news for those disciples? That wasn't the kind of news that would add to their already depressed condition, but it was something that would lift them up. It was indeed a day of great joy. Then listen to what the Apostle Paul said about this resurection, "And we declare unto you glad tidings, how that the promise which was made unto the fathers, God hath fulfilled the same unto us their children, in that he hath raised up Jesus again; as it is written in the second psalm, Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee. " Acts 13:32-33

Friends, do you like to carry glad tidings? Evidently the Apostle Paul did and I do too. How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? how shall they preach, except they be sent? as it is written, How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!"

Do you remember what blind Bartimaeus did when Jesus called for him and some of the folks round about the Lord brought the word to Bartimaeus. He didn't just sit there as if the Lord had said nothing. Listen to this, "And he, casting away his garment rose, and came to Jesus." That was good news to a blind man. He was glad to hear it. Well, I reckon he was for the Lord healed his eyes and made him able to see again. Now, dear ones, what are you doing with the good news? Do you receive it gladly? I believe if you do, you will do something about it. Suppose you go and tell others too. The Lord saves us for service anyway. Let us not sit at our places and say there's nothing I can do. But let us be up and about our father's business.




