## "...the greatest of these is charity"

Radio Broadcast for week of February 14, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. It is surely good to know that we have many listeners out there who hear the broadcast over KGGF. It would be difficult for me to acknowledge on the air every one from whom we have heard, but I would like to say a special good morning to Mrs. Lorena O. Dyer in Sedan, Kan. We hope you are listening. Also Mrs. Beryl Pense in Coffeyville, Kan. as well as the many many others who have written to us from time to time. Then we send our special greetings of love to the South land and those who listen over KCKW from Jena, La. Then there is WFPR in Hammond, La. to which many of our dear friends listen. May God bless every one of you wherever you may be.

There is one thing about having a large audience. I can count on someone catching up with me if I make a mistake. Take for instance this letter: I quote, "I was rereading a Mission Trail one day. As I had my Bible handy for some reason, I decided to check that scripture. I found error in the number of the chapter and verse, but the verse was right. I think it was the first scripture given in that paper and I believe it was Mission Trail dated Oct. 2, 1970. I don't usually check those scriptures. That might be the only error made in one, so I don't know why I just happen to check it, but as I did I thought maybe I should mention it. " End of quote Now that letter comes from Geneva Pierro, Earlimart, Calif. Thank you, Geneva, for calling my attention to this error. We endeavor to be accurate but someway a wrong number of a chapter or verse seems to slip by us at times. But now that you've mentioned it, let me just give you this scripture again which says, "And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax

cold." That verse is found in Matt. 24:12. It is not chapter 14 as previously mentioned. But that is a good verse. I surely believe it is true today. There is a lot of iniquity abounding and because of it many folks are falling away from the truth. Their love is growing cold. Let us be one of those who will endure unto the end.

Now, listen to this, "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, and have not charity, I am become as sounding brass, or a tinkling cymbal. And though I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries, and all knowledge; and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, and have not charity, I am nothing. And though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor, and though I give my body to be burned and have not charity, it profiteth me nothing." I Cor. 13:1-3 I would say that it is certainly necessary to have faith. In fact, without it we cannot even be saved. We must believe that God is and that he is a rewarder

of them that diligently seek him. It is also a wonderful blessing to have knowledge. Hos. 4:6 brings this out, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge: because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, that thou shalt be no priest to me: seeing thou hast forgotten the law of thy God, I will also forget thy children. " A wonderful thing it must be, indeed, to have the gift of prophecy and understand all mysteries. It is also a convincing thing to hear a speaker who is a natural orator who can just move one to tears, it seems, even at will. But did you know there is something greater than every one of these things? Charity or the divine love of God is greater than all. Now, further on down in the 13th chapter of I Cor. we are told some of the things that charity will do. Charity suffers a long time, and is kind. Charity envieth not, is not puffed up. Another thing about it: it doesn't seek her own welfare only, it will think of others. Then it is not easily provoked, thinketh no evil, and doesn't rejoice in iniquity but rejoices in the truth. Ilike the way the 7th verse says it, "Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. " Then we are told that "Charity never faileth". The 13th verse says, "And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity."

However it is one thing to say that we have charity or the love of God within our hearts, and it is quite another thing to really have it there. Jesus said, "If ye love me, keep my commandments." John 14:15 That is easy to understand, isn't it? If you love somebody you just naturally want to please them, so Jesus said "if ye love me keep my commandments". There is no need for us to say we love the Lord unless we are willing to obey him. Do you remember

that little poem which was in the school books of the years gone by? Listen,

#### WHICH LOVED BEST?

"I love you, Mother," said little Ben; Then, forgetting his work, his cap went on,

And he was off to the garden swing, And left her the water and wood to bring.

"I love you, Mother," said rosy Nell-"I love you better than tongue can tell";
Then she teased and pouted full half
the day,

Till her mother rejoiced when she went to play.

"I love you, Mother," said little Fan,
"Today I'll help you all I can;
How glad I am that school doesn't
keep!"

So she rocked the babe till it fell asleep.

Then, stepping softly, she fetched the broom,




