“...do all to the glory of God”

Radio Broadcast for week of February 21, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. We hope that today finds you encouraged in the service of the Lord. It is surely a blessing to be coming your way another time by means of radio. I feel that I am deeply indebted to God and to those who make it possible for me to bring you this weekly message. The sincere desire of my heart is to be faithful and to be a good steward over that which God has entrusted to my care. A very special thanks to every one who has written to us recently. Your letters of encouragement mean much to us. We appreciate also the offerings which you send to help us move forward in this work of faith.

Now, listen to this scripture. "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." I Cor. 10:31 Don't you believe that it is a good policy to use this verse as a guidepost in life? It might be that some things which are questionable would be left undone if folks would ask themselves this question, "Can I do this to the glory of God?" This would cover a wide field of activity. The verse said, "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink," I believe there are certain things which a Christian should not eat or drink, don't you? But let me make this a little more specific. In the years gone by society as a whole rejected the thought of a lady smoking a cigarette. Now this isn't particularly eating or drinking, but it is something that pertains to the welfare of our bodies. Oh yes, it was somewhat tolerated by society for certain men to smoke, but even nature itself seemed to teach us that it was not in good taste for a lady to smoke.

But oh, how things have changed as the years went by!

Then, too, there were, no doubt, those fathers who would indulge in the habit of smoking but they would tell their sons, "now you just leave this smoking alone." In other words "you wait until you grow up". But do you know what? I suppose that Junior considered "if it is good for dad, it is good for me too". And who knows? Perhaps he had some grounds for such conclusions, don't you think? But as this habit of smoking became more and more widespread folks weren't confined to "smoking rooms" in train and bus stations. Often now they are not restricted even in places of eating where food is being served. But the air becomes filled with foul smelling tobacco smoke. Even those who do not indulge in the habit themselves come from public buildings with their clothes smelling strong with the scent of smoke.

But now it seems that certain others have begun to realize the damage which is done. Medical publications warn of the dangers of lung cancer and heart damage. But if you think this is appal-

ling, I want you to listen to this quotation which I have taken from a school publication of the Guthrie Junior High School. As you notice the initials GJHS just remember that they stand for Guthrie Junior High School. Allright, here is the quote which was found on the front page of this publication:

"GJHS POLL SHOWS 23% SMOKE!!!

GJHS HAS STUDENT SMOKERS

"Would you have believed that 23 percent of GJHS students smoke? Well, do believe it, because in a recent survey taken in the science classes, this was proved true. One hundred twelve students out of four hundred ninety-five enrolled in our school do smoke! In the survey taken, the students were asked to write yes or no about the question being asked. The teachers then turned the information to the newspaper.

"To these one hundred twelve students, we ask, 'Do you realize not only what you are doing to yourself, but to the air around you which others must breathe?'

"The things that cigarettes do for? you aren't worth it. If you smoke one pack a day, you lose \$180 in one year, and some of the diseases they cause may cripple or kill you--such diseases as chronic bronchitis, emphysema, and lung cancer. Cigarettes are really a start to death.

"Please don't say you can't quit. You can! Every year one million people stop smoking. Why won't one of them be you?" End of quote.

Now, friends, isn't that alarming? Just to think that in this junior high school where my son who is 15 years old attends

school that 23% of the total enrolled of 495 students smoke. I suppose that includes boys and girls too. You see that is almost 500 students. Well, out of that number 112 students smoke.

Can you imagine how long such a thing would have existed in the schools which you and I who are 50 years old, or past, attended in the days of our youth? I am very much afraid that it would not have existed in those days to the extent that it does now. But let us ask ourselves "What is the answer to this problem?" Well, for one thing, I believe that this article itself is a step in the right direction. But on the other hand I believe it is necessary to begin such instruction before this time. It should begin with these junior boys and girls long before they reach this age that we are speaking about. Do you remember that verse of scripture which says, "Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not depart from it"? But how can parents train their children in the way they should go when the parents themselves are not setting the proper example. I say the problem begins in the home. Here is where instruction is needed and here is where example should be set.

Well, don't forget the text, "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God." I Cor. 10:31 You see, there are many other ways to displease the Lord and harm our own bodies by overindulgence. And now this poem:

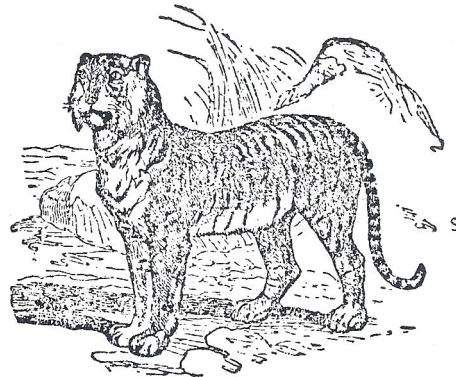

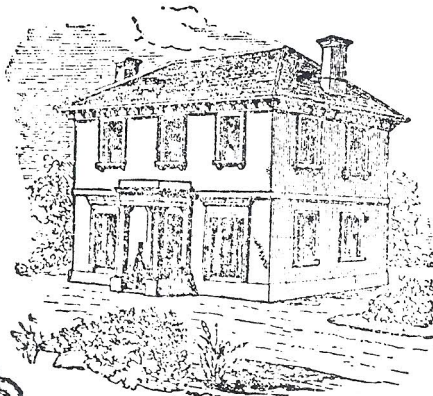
