"The Lord Hath Need of Him"

Radio Broadcast for week of March 14, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. It is indeed a pleasure to be coming your way by means of radio. I hope that your life will be enriched by the scriptures and thoughts presented on The Mission Trail broadcast. I can surely say that my life has been enriched and I am glad that I have found a place in the kingdom of God where I "fit". If you feel that you are a "misfit" in life, do you suppose it might be because you have not found God's will for you? Or if you have found and know what God's will is, then are you filling that place in life? I am convinced that this is the way one finds happiness and contentment—that is, to know the will of God and to do it. Jesus said in reference to his will along a certain line, "If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them."

Now, listen to this scripture, "And it came to pass, when he was come nigh to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount called the mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, Saying, Go ye into the village over against you; in the which at your entering ye shall find a colt tied, whereon yet never man sat: loose him, and bring him hither. And if any man ask you, Why do ye loose him? thus shall ye say unto him, Because the Lord hath need of him. And they that were sent went their way, and found even as he had said unto them. And as they were loosing the colt, the owners thereof said unto them, Why loose ye the colt? And they said, The Lord hath need of him. And they brought him to Jesus: and they cast their garments upon the colt, and they set Jesus thereon." Luke 19:29-35

One thing is so very outstanding to me about this scripture and that is found here in verse 31. Listen, "Because the Lord hath need of him." It indicates

to me that here was something the Lord needed. In other words he could use it for the moment to the glory of God. It was a rather small thing he needed, just a colt. That was small enough, wasn't it? I don't suppose this colt would have been worth very much, do you think so? It was not broken to ride because the scriptures said "whereon yet never man sat". So that colt wasn't used to hauling people around on its back and I doubt very seriously if it was used to pulling a load.

When I was on the island of Jamaica last Sept., I saw that the folks down there used many different modes of transportation. Some of them ride the bus or van. Some have automobiles and travel that way. Some of them even walk on foot or ride bicycles. Then there are those using the very fast way of flying in airplanes. In fact, that is the way we got to Jamaica on Pan American Airlines. But there was one other way they traveled too. Do you

know what that way is? Some of them rode little donkeys, often carrying heavy loads up the mountain side. One day my daughter and I walked along beside a donkey which a young boy was leading. This lad had some ice which the donkey was carrying for him up the mountain side to the boy's home. Wouldn't you say that boy "needed" that donkey? It seems to me he did. It was hard enough for me to climb that mountain without carrying any extra weight.

Now, remember this: There are some things the Lord needs today. Some of them may seem small and insignificant and yet they are important things. Are you willing to render to the Lord that which you have and he needs? Well, you might be inclined to think "I don't have anything the Lord needs." I doubt that. First of all, let me say the Lord needs the services of every person, especially every true child of God. The Lord needs you. Then really if he gets you and your heart he has everything that you have along with it.

Here is something else it might be well to remember. Do you know there are plenty of things we need in life? Sometimes, of course, we might be inclined to think that we need a lot more things which are not really necessary. Nevertheless there are certain things we need. Some of these things can come from God only. Well, really every good and perfect thing does come from God even though it may come to us through an indirect manner by other people. Yet it is God who sends it.

I believe if we are faithful to give of ourselves, time, and money for God's need and the needs of those whom God loves, that in return when we need help we can have confidence and assurance when we call upon the Lord that he will hear us. Those owners of that colt could have said "This colt belongs to me and you're not loosing him and taking him away". But when they learned that the Lord needed him they just let the colt go. Don't you like that way of doing? As soon as you learn God's will, why don't you just say, "Yes, Lord, that's exactly what I want to do."

Listen to this poem:

I Need Thee, Lord

I need thee, Lord; I need thy help today

To guide me onward in my pilgrim way.

My vision far too narrow is to see The rugged path of duty leading up to thee.

I need thee, Lord; I need thy strong right hand

To lead me upward to that brighter land.

Alone I feebly falter on my way; I can not do without thee, Lord, e'en one short day.

I need thee, Lord, to strengthen lest I fall;

The foes that gather round my way appall.

I need thy boundless grace lest I should fall

And be far driven from the harbor by the gale.

I need thee when the waking sun doth rise.

And till its last beams die in western skies;

Still in the darkness would I have thee near

To hold my hand, to keep my soul, to calm each fear.

Dear ones, Ibelieve it pleases the Lord for us to acknowledge our need of him. We need him every moment of the passing day. Without him we can do nothing. Then here is a scripture which should bring comfort and assurance to you: "And seek not ye what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink, neither be ye of doubtful mind. For all these things do the nations of the world seek after: and your Father knoweth that ye have need of these things. But rather seek ye the kingdom of God; and all these things shall be added unto you." Luke 12:29-31 Here is another which is good too. "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus. ' Phil. 4:19

Then finally here is our invitation to get the grace and help we need from God. "Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need." Heb. 4:16

Let us pray,

Our Father,

We do come boldly to the throne of grace and humbly ask for our needs and the needs of those who are looking to thee from day to day. May the scriptures and message of this broadcast fill a particular need of those who hear it. Do for us that which you see best and thine shall be the praise through Christ our Lord. Amen

By thy stripes is perfect healing, In thy wounds are life and strength, From thy pierced and wounded body Flows the stream whose breadth and length


Covers earth with richest blessings, And contains the healing balm For our sins and sore distresses That our sorrows thou shouldst calm.
