Radio Broadcast for week of May 2, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

"Behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not. Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is. And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure." I John 3:1-3

Good morning, friends. I hope things are going well for you today. But above other things I trust that you are prospering in spiritual growth and keeping encouraged in the Lord. After all, these are the most important things in life. You see, some of these days our troubles and trials in this world will be over. So when that time comes we are looking forward to a better place which the Lord hath prepared for those who love him.

Now notice especially this last verse, "And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure. " I am sure this doesn't mean that we can be perfect in every respect for as long as we are in the body we are subject to mistakes. But I do believe that we can and should have purity Don't you remember what Jesus said in his Sermon on the Mount? "Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God." Now if it wasn't possible for our heart to be purified I don't believe Jesus would have said that, do you? How about these verses here in Acts 15:8, 9, "And God, which knoweth the hearts, bare them witness,

giving them the Holy Ghost, even as he did unto us; And put no difference between us and them, purifying their hearts by faith." Well, we ought to have 3 witnesses anyway concerning purity of heart, so listen to this one from I Tim. 1:5, "Now the end of the commandment is charity out of a pure heart, and of a good conscience, and of faith unfeigned".

But there is one thing sure. Folks who trust in their own self-righteousness are not going to have pure hearts. There was the Pharisee who went up to the temple to pray. He thought of himself as righteous. He no doubt sought to secure the favor of both God and man by the manner in which he prayed. He mentioned in his prayer the good deeds which he did. He said he fasted twice in a week and gave tithes of all that he possessed. seemed to be satisfied with a religion that only cleaned up the outside of his life. He was filled with self-righteousness, the fruit of his own work, and was judging by a human standard.

One of the characteristics of a person

who is self-righteous is to despise others. You see, he was judging himself by another man, the Publican. He felt that he was far superior to this poor publican who would not even so much as lift up his eyes to heaven to Do you suppose the publican didn't feel worthy to enter into the devotion which others may have been cffering there at the temple? I don't suppose he was praying to be heard of men. He was calling directly on God. "God be merciful to me a sinner". He didn't compare himself with others. He was seeking the pardon and peace which only God could give. I believe God blessed him. It is said that this man went down to his house justified rather than the other.

Here is another scripture which speaks of purity. This has to do with the purity of the soul. Listen, "Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently." I Peter 1:22

I believe when the Lord purifies our hearts through faith not only is our soul clean and our heart clean, but he gives a pure mind and conscience to go along with it. Some folks put on a mighty good appearance outwardly. They may have clean clothes, polished shoes, and combed hair, and still have a filthy mind. Listen to this verse, "For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ." I Cor. 2:16 Do you think anyone who had the mind of Christ would have any other but a pure mind? The Apostle Peter in his writing puts it this way, "This second epistle, beloved, I now write unto you; in both which I stir up your pure minds by way of remembrance". II Peter 3:1

Friends, it is a great blessing to have a pure heart, a pure mind, a pure soul, and then to go with all these things, a pure conscience. Listen to the testimony of Paul in his letter to Timothy, "I thank God, whom I serve from my forefathers with a pure conscience, that without ceasing I have remembrance of thee in my prayers night and day;" II Tim. 1:3

Friends, did you know the Bible even speaks about a pure language? I don't believe this is referring to pure English, pure Spanish, or pure German, but listen, "For then will I turn to the people a pure language, that they may all call upon the name of the Lord, to serve him with one consent." Zeph. 3:9 I believe that God understands all languages. This even includes the unwritten language spoken by the uncivilized tribes in the remote areas of the world. God knows that language. And another thing he knows too. He knows if a person has purity of heart, soul, and speech. Here is one more scripture in closing. It shows that even the thoughts of God's children are good ones, "Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things. " Phil. 4:8 Notice that verse says to "think on these things". Wouldn't that be pure thoughts? Listen to this poem:

Through the pure testimony you will overcome.

The world will not persecute those who are like them,

But hold them the same as their own; The pure testimony cries out separation,

Which causes false teachers to frown. Come out from foul spirits and practises too,

The track of your Savior keep still in your view;

The pure testimony will cut its way through.

Bless the words of the message as it goes out over the airwaves. May it profit those who hear and may the word of God purify their hearts through faith in Christ. Remember those who are passing through the deep waters of trials or persecutions. Comfort and strengthen them to be true to thee for we ask it in Jesus name. Amen

"Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled." Matthew 5:6

These are the words of our perfect example as he taught the disciples and the multitudes while he was in the mountain. Let us examine them a little more closely than usual. notice that these particular folks are going to receive a blessing. Who is it that does not like to be favored? Oh, the ungratitude of many who receive untold blessings and are yet ungrateful. But not so with these who hunger and thirst after righteousness! they are going to be filled. 


