The Second Coming!

Radio Broadcast for week of May 9, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. I am indeed happy to be coming your way on this Sunday morning. I am reminded that this is Mother's Day. It is a great blessing to have a godly mother. If your mother is still living, don't forget her, but show your love and appreciation while you have the opportunity to do so. My mother has long since departed from the walks of this life but I am deeply grateful for the things she taught me concerning the necessity of living for God. These have been a great blessing to me.

I hope you will stay tuned to this broadcast for a few moments while I speak to you about something which I consider very important, that is the second coming of Christ. Some folks think that at that time he will set up his kingdom here in this world and they will reign with him a thousand years. Or that is, somewhere along the line they're going to anticipate this reign. But I say unto you that Christ set up his kingdom when he came to this earth for the first time. Listen to this verse from Matt. 27:11, "And Jesus stood before the governor: and the governor asked him, saying, Art thou the King of the Jews? And Jesus said unto him, Thou sayest." The things which they didn't understand about Christ's kingdom was that it was a spiritual kingdom and was not of this world. These verses here in the 18th chapter of John bring that out. Jesus was speaking to Pilate when he said, "My kingdom is not of this world: if my kingdom were of this world, then would my servants fight, that I should not be delivered to the Jews: but now is my kingdom not from hence. Pilate therefore said unto

him, Art thou a king then? Jesus answered, Thou sayest that I am a king. To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth. Everyone that is of the truth heareth my voice."

So, friends, I say there are going to be plenty of things taking place at the second coming of the Lord, but I am afraid it isn't going to be what some

folks are looking for. Now listen to this scripture from the 3rd chapter of II Peter. Notice how accurately this describes the conditions which are existing in our present day. "Knowing this first, that there shall come in the last days scoffers, walking after their own lusts, And saying, Where is the promise of his coming? for since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation." Now that is verses 3 and 4. Did you notice it mentioned scoffers? To me this indicates folks who make light of the truth or sneer and scorn at the thought of the return of the Lord. Well, Peter foretold this already. So he said these folks would come.

But Jesus himself also accurately foretold what the kingdom of heaven was going to be like in the last days. He likened the kingdom of heaven unto 10 virgins which took their lamps and went forth to meet the bridegroom. Five of these young women were wise and five of them were foolish. You see, the wise ones took oil with them in their vessels, but the foolish did not take an adequate supply of oil. Consequently at midnight when the bridegroom came the foolish virgins were not ready to meet him. They needed more oil for their light. But it was too late to get it then. Haven't you noticed how easy it is to neglect to do things? These foolish virgins went to buy some oil because the wise ones wouldn't divide with them and I don't blame them for that. They needed what they had for themselves. Well, when the foolish virgins came back they said, "Lord, Lord, open to us. But he answered and said, Verily I say unto you, I know you not." Matt. 25:11, 12

Now listen to this positive declaration which Peter gives here in II Peter third

chapter again and verse 10, "But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up." Please notice that it says, "the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up." That surely doesn't sound to me like a literal reign of a thousand years upon some earthly throne. If the earth was burned up and the elements had melted where would there be a time or a place at the second coming of Christ for such a reign? Here is what I am looking for in this 13th verse. I quote, "Nevertheless we, according to his promise, look for new heavens and a new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness."

Dear ones, I say it is time that folks were getting ready to meet the Lord. His coming may be sooner than you think. Jesus said, "And take heed to yourselves, lest at any time your hearts be overcharged with surfeiting, and drunkenness, and cares of this life, and so that day come upon you unawares. For as a snare shall it come on all them that dwell on the face of the whole earth. Watch ye therefore, and pray always, that ye may be accounted worthy to escape all these things that shall come to pass, and to stand before the Son of man." Luke 21:34-36 Now listen to this poem:
