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## "The Fool Hath Said . . ."

Radio Broadcast for week of June 27, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

"The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God. They are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good. The Lord looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, and seek God. They are all gone aside, they are all together become filthy: there is none that doeth good, no, not one. Have all the workers of iniquity no knowledge? who eat up my people as they eat bread, and call not upon the Lord. There were they in great fear: for God is in the generation of the righteous. Ye have shamed the counsel of the poor, because the Lord is his refuge. Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion! when the Lord bringeth back the captivity of his people, Jacob shall rejoice, and Israel shall be glad." Psalms 14

Good morning, friends. How are you today? Still living by faith, I trust, and I also hope that God is proving himself real to you and that he is working out his will in your life. This is indeed the way to be happy. This Psalm surely describes the condition of the hearts of folks who do not go God's way.

In writing of this first verse "the fool hath said in his heart there is no God" the commentator Adam Clarke put it this way: "nabal, which we render fool, signifies an empty fellow, a contemptible person, a villain. One who has a muddy head and an unclean heart; and, in his darkness and folly, says in his heart, 'There is no God.'" End of quote. Now, there are some folks who deny the existence of God and might be termed in the strictest sense an atheist, for they even deny the being of a god. Then, perhaps, there are people who don't absolutely deny the

existence, but they do not acknowledge a divine God as having anything to do in governing the world, or the lives of the people therein. There would be another class of people who profess to acknowledge God but really they deny him a place in their heart and live as if they were persuaded there was no God either to punish or reward. Isn't that a sad state of affairs? Listen to these verses from Titus, "Unto the pure all things are pure: but unto them that are defiled and unbelieving is nothing pure; but even their mind and conscience is defiled. They profess that they know God; but in works they denyhim, being abominable, and disobedient, and unto every good work reprobate." Titus 1:15. 16

Then notice on down in this 14th Psalm we find these words, "there is none that doeth good, no, not one." There may be people who would lead you to believe that this is speaking in general

of mankind every where, that there is no one who does good. To this charge let me reply that man in his natural state is depraved and alienated from God. How true this is, but don't forget that when God comes in he moves out that rubbish of hatred, malice, envy and strife and the very nature of his child is transformed from the kingdom of darkness into the kingdom of his dear son. I believe that there are saints of God in the world today whose hearts are pure through the blood of Christ. They have been transplanted and are no longer in the kingdom of Satan and working his will by committing many different forms of sin and evil.

Now, I don't like for one person to call another "a fool". Really, it is not our place to charge another with the accusation that they are a fool. But let me tell you, if God calls a person a fool, then he is indeed acting very foolishly.

Do you remember what Jesus said about the wealthy man who had no place to bestow his fruits and goods? decided that he would tear down his old barns and build bigger ones. Then he would store up his grain with the thought that he had plenty on hand to live many years in ease. He was going to take his ease, eat, drink, and be merry. But do you know what God said to that man? "Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee. " Don't you see that our lives are in God's hand? You may be ever so healthy, apparently, but did you know that God can call. you into eternity within a moment's notice? If you are not ready to meet him, then what are you going to do? I say we should act wisely and put God's will first in our lives.

Did you ever hear this poem:

#### THE FOOL'S PRAYER

The royal feast was done, the king Sought some new sport to banish care.

And to his jester cried, "Sir Fool, Kneel down, and make for us a prayer!"



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
