## "I Will Lift Up Mine Eyes Unto the Hills..."

Radio Broadcast for week of August 22, 1971 (See back page for list of stations.)

Good morning, friends. It is indeed a pleasure to be coming your way again by means of radio. Not long ago while visiting with some friends in Missouri a sister told me that their son, David, when he would hear the Mission Trail broadcast, would say, "Good morning, friends." You see he had been hearing me say that for a number of times over the air so he just picked it up, too, and would say, "Good morning, friends." David is not very old. He is just 6. So I am going to say a very special "Good morning, David."

Now, I realize that it would neither be practical nor convenient for me to call every friends' name that we have, for we like to think we have lots of friends. This would include folks in south La. around Hammond and Loranger who listen over WFPR as well as my home town--of Jena, and Midway, La., who hear the broadcast over KCKW. I believe we have some real friends down there. Then, there would be many in Kansas around Coffeyville, Anthony, Wichita, as well as others who listen over KGGF. You see it reaches down into Okla, and Mo, as well as a few friends we have over in Arkansas. Then, of course, the printed copies of the Mission Trail go into many states unreached by the broadcast, so when I say "good morning friends", just remember, this includes you, wherever you are. Sister Bowers from Swainsboro, Ga. wrote: "Brother Murphey, this is what I love to repeat . . . Psa. 121:1-2, 'I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help. My help cometh from the Lord, which made heaven and earth. "Well, I like that scripture too. In the midst of a

changing world, perplexities, troubles, afflictions, and persecutions isn't it good to know that our heavenly father careth for his own? But notice especially this part: "I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills. " If one gets the help they need they are going to have to lift up their eyes and get them off the material things of earth. So many have their eyes fastened on the things of earth. They seem to be charmed by the allurements of pleasures and the glitter of financial profits. Do you think the prodigal would have ever found his way back home to his father if he had not lifted up his eyes from the swine and the husks which they ate? Certainly not, but his mind went back to his father's house and he remembered that there was plenty to eat. Even the servants had more than he did. So what did he do? Well, He arose and put his thoughts into action.

Here is something else I want you to notice. "But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him." Luke 15:20 So you see, his father lifted up his eyes

too. To lift up the eyes, frequently means to direct and make known our desires to God by prayer. You might be surprised to know how many times this is mentioned in the Bible. might also be surprised to know what different ones have seen, when they lifted up their eyes. May I give you just a few? "And Lot lifted up his eyes, and beheld all the plain of Jordan, that it was well watered every where,..." Gen. 13:10. Do you know what Lot was looking for? The well watered plains for his herds and flocks. It was the material things. But as he pitched his tent that way which was towards Sodom. from day to day, he got into trouble and almost lost his life. "And the Lord said unto Abram, after that Lot was separated from him, Lift up now thine eyes, and look from the place where thou art northward, and southward, and eastward, and westward, "Gen, 13:14. This is when God gave the promise to Abram that he would give him the land and to his seed after him. He was seeking to please the Lord. Skipping on over to the 24 chapter of Gen. and verses 63 and 64, it is reported that "Isaac went out to meditate in the field at the eventide: and he lifted up his eyes, and saw, and, behold, the camels were coming." Do you know what the camels were bringing? It was a wife for Isaac. It was one of God's own choosing for him. It goes on to say: "And Rebekah lifted up her eyes, and when she saw Isaac. she lighted off the camel." I believe some folks get in too much of a hurry in looking for a companion and don't wait upon Him to direct them. They ought to go out and meditate in the field as Isaac did before they lift up their eyes, looking for a companion. There was another time after God led the people over and across the Jordan river by the hand of Joshua, that they came to Jericho, Now Jericho was a great walled city.

But it was in the promised land; the manna had ceased and here they faced a formidable enemy. Listen: "And it came to pass, when Joshua was by Jericho, that he lifted up his eyes and looked and, behold, there stood a man over against him with his sword drawn in his hand: and Joshua went unto him. and said unto him, Art thou for us, or for our adversaries? And he said, Nay, but captain of the host of the Lord am I now come." So here we see that God sent help in the time of need, but Joshua "lifted up his eyes and looked." In the 4th chapter of Daniel we find the account of that great and mighty king of Babylon, Nebuchadnezzar. He became so exalted that God dethroned him from his kingdom. He ate grass like the oxen for seven years. His body was wet with the dew of heaven. His hair grew like eagles feathers, and his nails like birds claws. He was more like a beast than a human. Don't you know there are many with that beastly nature in the world today? Are you inclined to think there is no hope for one like this? Then wait just a moment. This man lifted up his eyes. Listen to this: "And at the end of the days I Nebuchadnezzar lifted up mine eyes unto heaven, and mine understanding returned unto me, and I blessed the most High, and I praised and honoured him that liveth for ever, whose dominion is an everlasting dominion, and his kingdom is from generation to generation: And all the inhabitants of the earth are reputed as nothing: and he doeth according to his will in the army of heaven, and among the inhabitants of the earth: and none can stay his hand, or say unto him, What doest thou? At the same time my reason returned unto me; and for the glory of my kingdom, mine honour and brightness returned unto me; and my counsellors and my lords sought unto me; and I was established in my kingdom, and excellent

majesty was added unto me." Dan. 4:34-36 That which will give a person their right mind and good understanding may be obtained by lifting up their eyes to the God of all creation. Here is a poem:


