God Answers Drayer

Radio Broadcast for week of February 27, 1972 (See back page for list of stations)

"And it shall come to pass, that before they call, I will answer; and while they are yet speaking, I will hear." Isa. 65:24. Good morning, friends. Can you think of some special time when you were in need and God answered prayer for you before you called, or while you were yet speaking? That is quick service, isn't it? How many times have you waited in some lineup for your turn at the postoffice window, or to have an order filled at some cafe, or to be checked out at a discount food store or the like? We are naturally inclined to want fast service, especially in these days. Waiting is sometimes harder to do than to just get up and go.

Not long ago I was washing my car at a public coin-operated place of business and a lady drove up behind my car and waitedforalittle while for her turn, and then she drove away. She returned shortly, waited a little while longer, and then drove away for the second time about the time I was finishing. Do you suppose some good folks get tired of waiting on the Lord and leave before the answer comes? Well, the Lord wants us to have patience. Nevertheless, He knows just when we are ready for our answer and he is right on time. Remember the text "before they call, I will answer; and while they are yet speaking, I will hear. " Here is a report by an early-day pioneer minister, S. O. Susag: TWO INCIDENTS OF ANSWER TO PRAYER. I quote:

"For the glory of God I wish to relate two very definite instances of answer to prayer. Once while I was holding services nine miles north of Kerkhoven, Minn., the meetings were very good, but I was under a very severe trial, or test, and it seemed very difficult for me to learn the will of the Lord as to whether at the close of the meeting I should go home or to Grand Forks, N. Dak.

I learned that my fare from Kerkhoven to Grand Forks would be \$3.22. Then I went out in the grove (I think it was on Friday), and three times asked the Lord that on Sunday forenoon at the close of the services he would put it in the mind of somebody to give me exactly \$3.22 if he wanted me to go to Grand Forks. No one but the Lord knew about my needs. After I had prayed the third time, the Spirit clearly witnessed to me that the Lord was going to answer my prayer by giving me the money asked for.

On Sunday after the services, while I was shaking hands with the people, a brother put some money in my outside coatpocket. When I left the house, I walked out in the grove to the same spot where I had prayed, and thanked God for \$3.22 in my pocket; and when I counted the money, I found that it was the exact amount for which I had prayed. He not

only supplied my car-fare, but had in this way made known his will to me.

Before Ileft the next morning, the brethren had given me more, so that I had something to send to my family.

The second incident that I desire to relate occurred at the time when the Lord made it very clear to me to go to a certain place in South Dakota where the full gospel had never been preached. This also was on Friday, and I knew that the Lord was directing me to go on the following Wednesday. I was in need of some clothes, as my suit was not fit to wear in public, and I was also in need of the car-fare.

An old sister who is now at the Old People's Home at St. Paul Park, Minn. was with us and, together with my wife, we had a season of prayer and agreed that the Lord would supply this need before Wednesday morning. While we were in prayer, the Lord made it clear and definite that he would grant our petition. As we arose from our knees, I said, "Thank God! I have the money by faith," and the old sister said, "Well, I suppose you have to write to some of the well-to-do-brethren and tell them your need." She knew that quite an amount of money would be required.

"No," said I, "the Lord will tell them. I may make a mistake if I undertake to write to any one." "You will not have the money, then," she said. "Yes, Mother, "I said; "you will see before Wednesday morning that I shall have all I need." But she doubted and said she would see.

The Lord poured out his Spirit upon me with such an assurance that I went out of the house and leaped and praised the Lord, not knowing that any one but the

Lord saw me. But the old mother happened to look through the kitchen window and saw me, and she said, "What is the matter with the brother?" My wife replied, "I suppose he is happy because he knows that the Lord has heard his prayer," and so I was.

The following Sunday we went to Colfax, Minn., and held a service, at which place I received one dollar and said, "Thank God for one dollar."

On Monday I received a letter from a brother who lives at Sisseton, S. Dak., which contained a check for seven dollars. The check was from a man whom I did not know that I had ever seen, and He did not know my address, but gave the check to a brother at that place who knew my address, and told him to send it immediately, as he was impressed to send it to me. The old mother knew this brother and said he was wealthy and could well afford to send it. I said to her, "Did I not tell you that the Lord knew to whom to speak?" She was very much astonished.

I received another letter, in which was a check from a brother whom I had not seen for four years. He wrote that while he was coming from Brookston, Minn., where he had been working, and was nearing Wadena, Minn., the Spirit of the Lord told him to hurry to the bank before it closed and send Brother Susag a donation. In his letter he said that he thought I must be in great need, and that he hurried and reached the bank in time to get the money. He further said, "May the Lord bless you and use you to his glory."

By Wednesday morning I had my carfare, a suit of clothes, and an extra pair of trousers, and when I landed at Arlington, S. Dak., I had forty-eight cents left for postage-stamps. Thank God, his Word is true, which says, "Before you call I will answer."

May this encourage some one in need to call upon God, who is always a very present help in time of need.

End of quote. I like that way in which the Lord answered prayer for that brother, don'tyou? It is those personal experiences we have which helps to strengthen our faith in God and his word. I hope you have had experiences and answers like these. God has in wonderful ways supplied our needs and we are still looking to him for his guidance and the answers to prayer. It is even more real when we know that others do not even know, or have not been told of our needs. It shows even more conclusively that God is ever mindful of his own.

And now this verse:

HAVE COURAGE

Courage when the road is rocky,
Courage when the skies are gray!
Courage when you've been defeated,
Courage when hope's fled away!
Courage when your faith is shaken,
Couragewhen strength's failed you too,
May God grant you daily courage
That will always see you through!

This verse was recently sent us on a lovely card which meant so much to us. Surely in this day we need an extra supply of grace and courage to press our way heavenward against the forces of evil. Pray for us as we also pray for you!

Our father, bless the word as it goes out over the air to the many listeners. In turn may they also be blessed by a fresh touch from the Lord to press on for thee. No, doubt many of them have petitions waiting now at thy throne for some burden or problem. Answer each in thine own special way and to thee we will give the glory in the name of Jesus. Amen.


