A Witness From India

Radio Broadcast for September 1, 1974

"After this I beheld, and, lo, a great multitude, which no man could number, of all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues, stood before the throne, and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands; And cried with a loud voice, saying, Salvation to our God which sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb."

Friends, Iam glad to bring you the report today that salvation encompasses every land beyond the seas and throughout the world, if they meet the requirements of being a born-again Christian. I am glad to be coming your way again with a short message from the Word of the Lord and we hope that you will get a blessing from it. I have a special treat for you. I have with me in, we might say, the Mission Trail studio -really, it's not that much of a studio, but right here where I do my recording and the printing of the Mission Trail. I have with me a young brother from India. But I'm going to let him speak for himself. Many of you have met him as he has traveled throughout the country this summer. So, Brother John Varghese from India, could you tell us a little about yourself?

Bro. John: I am John Varghese, 28 years old from Kerala State, South India. I belong to a Christian family in Kerala State, India. I have a very good degree, eleven years in schools and six years in college...

...but this degree could not give meany rest, or any salvation from

my sin. Because we read in the Bible—the yoke of Christ is easy and his burden is very light. So now I am experiencing the rest of peace. I experience salvation from Christ, so I am now happy in spirit because I have this great salvation in Christ.

Oh, I am glad to hear that. Then in other words, you do believe in a bornagain Christian?

Bro. John: Surely I believe in that doctrine. If a person being born in a Christian family, or if he is a member of a Christian church he is not necessarily a real Christian. Christian means Christ-in. When Christ comes into his heart he becomes a Christian.

Oh, that's wonderful... Now, it is good to be born in a Christian family. That's fine, but that isn't the thing that's going to make you a child of God. But if I understandit correctly, Christianity is not the native religion of India?

Bro. John: No, India is a nation of Hindus and also Moslems. Only Christians live in Kerala State. That is my state. Of all the population of India there is only one place they have Christians. And now we have no persecution in Kerala State, but outside Kerala State Christians do have persecutions.

Oh, how much we have to be thankful for, friends, in this country. Tell me a little bit about the new birth. How long have you been saved?

Bro. John: I have been saved about seven years before, in the preaching by my father. My father was a minister of Church of God and he preached in the chapel one night about salvation and that preaching really stirred my heart. And I came to the altar with greathumbleness and humility and God gave me salvation.

Oh, I am glad to hear that. Now, let's move on a little further here. You have come to the states. Is this your first trip to the United States?

Bro. John: Yes, this is my first trip to the United States and this is my first trip from outside my states.

Well, how many states have you visited here in the United States since coming here?

Bro. John: Here I visited about twentyeight states and I covered about twelve thousand miles.

Think of that—twenty—eight states and twelve thousand miles. Friends, perhaps we could say a lot of folks here in the states have never seen that much of the country. But Bro. John, what was your impression of the United States; just in general?

Bro. John: United States is a rich country beyond my expectation, a wealthy nation with all conveniences and facili-

ties. But I understand that the saints in the United States, they utilize these facilities and conveniences for the glory of Jesus Christ.

Now, let me see, you said you were how old?

Bro. John: I am twenty-eight years old. And tell us a little bit about your family back home.

Bro. John: I have a mother, five brothers, three sisters in my home.

A wife?

Bro. John: And also a wife and a one year old son.

Oh, yes, that's important too. And friends, after he's been away this long, I suspect that he may be getting a little anxious to go back. But it's been wonderful for him to be here in the states to visit so many of the congregations of the saints. He's traveled many many places and visited many of the congregations and I believe this has been a great help, not only to him but to the congregations instead. Well, how about when you go back. Any particular plans as to what you would like to do and what you plan to do, Lord willing, in regard to laboring in the gospel there?

Bro. John: Yes, when I go back to India the first thing I wish to do is I will teach the saints in India about the love of Christ, about expression of Christian love, more than they do now. And again, I wish to print tracts in my language to distribute among the many Hindus in India. Now I have some English tracts but I have to translate these English tracts into Malayalam language and distribute to many perishing souls in my state and in other states of India.

Yes, we must understand and should understand that this is not Bro. John's native language. I think he does an excellent job of speaking in English. I hope you have been able to get most of what he has said. But his native language is--let's see. Would you say it again for us?

Bro. John: Malayalam language.

All right, very good. Bro. John, do you think of any particular scripture that you would like to leave for all the listeners of the Mission Trail broadcast to remember?

Bro. John: Yes, in Psalms 34, verse 8 we read a scripture: "O taste and see that the Lord is good: blessed is the man that trusteth in him."

Oh how wonderful to taste and see that the Lord is good, and that's true. It works, dear ones. Let me tell you, it works in this language, English, and it works in his native language of India and anywhere people will really come to the Lord. There is one scripture says the heavens declare the glory of God and the firmament showeth his handiwork. How true that is.

So--I tell you what let's do. Let's take time out. Our time is getting away so quickly, but let's take time out right now, look to the Lord in a word of prayer.

Our Father, we are so thankful for the privilege of bringing the gospel...over the airwaves. There are many out there who have heard the broadcast from time to time. Some of them have written us and they've told us how they enjoyed it and we appreciate this. Today we pray that the spirit of God may bear the words of the message today to the hearts of

everyone who hears. Bless and help them to walk in the light, do your will from day to day and we'll surely give you the praise in Jesus name. Amen. Now, let me also say that if you would like to write us or get in touch with us, you may address your letter to The Mission Trail, Guthrie, Oklahoma. We normally have a song here on the broadcast and I tell you what I'd like to do. I would like for Brother John to sing you a song today in his own native language from India. The song you have, is--"Heavenly Sunlight"?

Bro. John: Yes, Heavenly Sunlight. I will sing it in Malayalam language. Oh, do that! All right, let's hear it in your language...Oh, that's wonderful to be walking in heavenly sunlight. But I'll tell you what let's do, Bro. John. Let's you and I try to sing a verse of this in English for the folks. They might understand that better. Would that be all right? Bro. John: Yes.

All right!...Oh, that's wonderful. Now, friends, you may hear better talent. I will agree to that, but after all you don't often hear a young man from India who has accepted the Lord and who loves Him, sing here in your own language in English. So it's wonderful to have you here Bro. John. We hope that you will come back and bring your wife some time. Any last word that you'd like to say to the listeners of The Mission Trail broadcast?

Bro. John: Dear ones, If we do not have any more chance to me'et again in this earth, we will meet in heaven when the morning star comes in that morning day!

Thank you, Bro. John. And so friends, until we meet again, this is Willie Murphey and John Varghese saying God bless and keep you and a very cheerful goodbye!
