"The Presence of the Lord"

Radio Broadcast for week of October 6, 1974

"Oh how great is thy goodness, which thou hast laid up for them that fear thee; which thou hast wrought for them that trust in thee before the sons of men! Thou shalt hide them in the secret of thy presence from the pride of man: thou shalt keep them secretly in a pavilion from the strife of tongues." Psa. 31:19-20.

Good morning, good morning! What a wonderful thing to trust in God and to know He will hide us in his pavilion. May this day find each of you safe in the arms of God. Dear ones, it is a good thing for us to know that we are continually in the presence of the Lord. In fact, that is what I want to talk about "the presence of the Lord!" I am so glad the Lord's presence is ever near to those who love him. And to those who would flee from the presence of the Lord, they will encounter difficulty and trouble. The writer put it this way in Psalms 139 and beginning with verse 7:

"Whither shall I go from thy spirit? or whither shall I flee from thy presence? If I ascend up into heaven, thou art there: If I make my bed in hell, behold, thou art there. If I take the wings of the morning, and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea; Even there shall thy hand lead me, and thy right hand shall hold me. If I say, Surely the darkness shall cover me; even the night shall be light about me. Yea, the darkness hideth not from thee; but the night shineth as the day: the darkness and light are both alike to thee."

That gives me a knowledge of the presence of God all around me. But let me give you some examples of those who endeavored to get away from the presence of the Lord. After the creation when Adam and Eve had disobeyed the command of God, they experienced a certain guilt which settled down on their lives. They were ashamed to meet the Lord as before.

"And they heard the voice of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day: and Adam and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among st the trees of the garden." Gen. 3:8. Now, why did they endeavor to hide and get away from the presence of the Lord? Because their hearts condemned them. They had sinned. They wanted to get away from it all.

There was also Cain who slew his brother Abel. He claimed not to know where his brother was but his blood was crying unto God from the ground. Cain wanted to flee and get away from his guilt. Listen: "And Cain went out from the presence of the Lord, and dwelt in

the land of Nod, on the east of Eden." Gen. 4:16.

In the sense of favor and blessings of God, Adam and Eve and also Cain did depart from the presence of the Lord. Think of those who today are seeking to get away from their guilt. They don't feel comfortable in the presence of the Lord or His people.

When Pharaoh's heart was hardened in rebellion against the children of Israel he didn't want Moses and Aaron in his presence only when he needed them to call on God to stay the plagues from Egypt. One time he told them: "Not so: go now ye that are men, and serve the Lord; for that ye did desire. And they were driven out from Pharaoh's presence." Exodus 10:11.

I am much impressed with the actions of Gehazi, the servant of Elisha. This man had seen the miracles of Elisha. He had been in his presence many times. He knew what God could do. Naaman was healed of the leprosy and offered clothing and silver to Elisha. This he refused to take. But when Naaman was down the road a ways, Gehazi thought this was one opportunity he wasn't going to pass up. Sohe followed Naaman who saw him coming and asked about his welfare. Then Gehazi said some prophets had come to his master and he wanted some clothing and silver. This was willingly given. But all this time Gehazi was not telling the truth. After the clothing and silver was safely hidden back in the house, Gehazi went in and stood before Elisha as before.

Elisha asked him where he had been and he said I haven't been anywhere. But listen to these fateful words of Elisha: I quote: "The leprosy therefore of Naaman shall cleave unto thee,

and unto thy seed for ever. And he went out from his presence a leper as white as snow." 2 Kings 5:27.

Here is another example of someone trying to get away from the presence of the Lord. "But Jonah rose up to flee unto Tarshish from the presence of the Lord, and went down to Joppa; and he found a ship going to Tarshish: so he paid the fare thereof and went down into it, to go with them unto Tarshish from the presence of the Lord." Jonah 1:3.

Now, who of us do not know the trouble and sorrow Jonah went through when he sought to flee from the presence of the Lord? He repented and changed his course after God was finished with him.

But when people depart from the Lord and from the truth there is usually a reason for it:

"They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would no doubt have continued with us: but they went out, that they might be made manifest that they were not all of us." I John 2:19.

A departing and going away from the Lord indicates evil and wickedness. This is manifested by Satan himself. Listen: "And the Lord said unto Satan, Behold, all that he hath is in thy power; only upon himself put not forth thine hand. So Satan went forth from the presence of the Lord." Job 1:12. So this is what Satan is doing continually—going forth from the presence of the Lord. And many others are doing the same thing. Here it is again:

"So Satan went forth from the presence of the Lord, and smote Job with sore boils from the sole of his foot unto his crown." Job 2:7.

But I am glad I can show you the other side of the picture. Not everyone is departing from the presence of the Lord. Some are seeking God's favor and blessings. And oh, the joy it brings. Here is God's promise to Moses: "And he said, My presence shall go with thee, and I will give thee rest. And he said unto him, If thy presence go not with me, carry us not up hence." Exodus 33:14-15.

Then this 100th Psalm. It has five verses: "Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all yelands. Serve the Lord with gladness: come before his presence with singing. Know ye that the Lord he is God: it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name. For the Lordis good; his mercy is everlasting; and his truth endureth to all generations."

Here is another verse I like: "Now unto him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy, To the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and for ever. Amen." Jude 24-25.

Also these verses are encouraging: "Thou wilt shew me the path of life: in thy presence is fullness of joy; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore."

But may I also remind you that the Lord has not forgotten these wicked people who have hardened their hearts: "And to you who are troubled rest with us, when the Lord Jesus shall be revealed from heaven with his mighty angels, In flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ: Who shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord, and from the glory of his power..." 2 Thess. 1:7-9.

Dear ones, may I encourage you to seek the presence of the Lord. That is the place where peace and satisfaction is found. Now this poem:

THE FATHER'S HAND

While through this changing world below I would not choose my path to go; 'Tis Father's hand that leadeth me, Then O how safe His child must be.

Sometimes we walk in sunshine bright, Sometimes in darkness of the night; Sometimes the way I cannot see But Father's hand still leadeth me.

Sometimes there seems no way to take, But Father's hand a way doth make. Sometimes I hear Him gently say, "Come follow Me, this is the way."

Why should I mind the way I go? His way is best for me, I know. He is my strength, my truth, my way, He is my comfort, rod, and stay.

So on we travel hand in hand, Bound for the heavenly promised land Always through all Eternity, I'll praise His name for leading me.

Our Father in heaven, bless the message to the good of every listener. Should there be those who are seeking to flee from the presence of the Lord, we pray they may know that will bring sorrow and remorse. Help them to come to repentance and find forgiveness and thine shall be the praise through Christ, our Lord. Amen....



Bro. Charles E. Stites


