Three Hindrances to the Work of God

Radio Broadcast for October 8, 1978

A very cheerful good morning to all the listeners of the broadcast! How happy I am that God has made it possible for me to come your way once again with a short gospel message! The preaching of the truth is needed today as much or even more than ever before!

AUTUMN

Gone is the spring with all its flowers, And gone the summer's verdant show; Now strewn beneath the autumn bowers, The yellow leaves await the snow.

Behold this earth so cold and gray, An emblem of our life appears; Its blooming robes sink to decay, To rise again in round of years.

Earth cheers its winter's sleep with dreams

Of springtime's warmth and gentle rain, When she shall wake to murmuring streams,

And songs of merry birds again.

So we came forth like springtime flowers,

Soon into manhood's summer grow, Then like the leaves of autumn bowers, Lie down beneath the winter's snow.

And there our bodies slumb'ring wait, Till time's short winter day has fled, And Christ, our Lord and Advocate, Shall come again to wake the dead. Then winter's storm and summer's heat Shall end in everlasting spring, And all immortal we shall meet, And round the throne of glory sing.

Listen to the scripture:

"Wherefore, my beloved, as ye have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling. For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of his good pleasure. Do all things without murmurings and disputing: That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the nidst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world;" Phil. 2:12-15.

Dear ones, I speak to you today on the subject of "Three Hindrances to the Work of God." I believe I would list them in this order:

- 1. Murmurings and disputings
- 2. Unbelief
- 3. Hypocrites

The first topic is found in this 14th verse just given from the scripture: "Do all things without murmurings and disputings:" How many times has God been displeased with his people because of their murmurings and complainings. The way is rough and the battle is long. There is no end in sight and we wish for this or that comfort. But as a good soldier of the cross, saints must endure with boldness and aggression against the enemy of the cross. Take as an example the bravery of the soldiers under the command of Gen. George Washington back in the Revolutionary war. It was the winter of 1776. soldiers were poorly clad and the Delaware River was icy and cold. But beyond that river was the enemy of their country. It was Christmas eve and these brave men crossed that Delaware river. I can imagine the chilly water as they entered it with their weapons of war. I wonder how many thought of their wives and children backhome for whom they were fighting. They did it bravely.

The command was to attack and attack they did! The enemy was taken by surprise and capture was made of more than a thousand soldiers. Murmuring and complaining will not bring the results that endurance and hardship will produce.

The judgment of God rests against evil murmurers. Listen: "Behold, the Lord cometh with ten thousands of his saints, To execute judgment upon all, and to convince all that are ungodly among them of all their ungodly deeds which they have ungodly committed, and of all their hard speeches which ungodly sinners have spoken against him. These are murmurers, complainers, walking after their own lusts; and their mouth speaketh great swelling words..."
Jude 14-16.

Again: "Neither murmur ye, as some of them murmured, and were destroyed of the destroyer. Now all these things happened unto them for ensamples: and they are written for our admonition, upon whom the ends of the world are come." 1 Cor. 10:10-11.

One more scripture concerning murmuring: "And the people chode with Moses, and spake, saying, Would God that we had died when our brethren died before the Lord! And why have ye brought up the congregation of the Lord into this wilderness, that we and our cattle should die there? And wherefore have ye made us to come up out of Egypt, to bring us in unto this evil place? it is no place of seed, or of figs, or of vines, or of pomegranates; neither is there any water to drink." Num. 20:3-5. How quickly they had forgotten all the Lord had done for them in bringing them through the Red Sea, the plagues sent upon the Egyptians and the manna in the wilderness. quickly the eyes of folks are blinded when they begin to murmur and complain!

This then brings me to the next hindrance. Two: Unbelief. This time it was Moses and Aaron, the leaders of God's children. Here was Moses, the meekest man who ever lived, affected by unbelief. But let us get the facts from the scriptures:

"And the Lord spake unto Moses, saying, Take the rod, and gather thou the assembly together, thou, and Aaron thy brother, and speak ye unto the rock before their eyes; and it shall give forth his water, and thou shalt bring forth to them water out of the rock: so thou shalt give the congregation and their beasts drink. And Moses and Aaron gathered the congregation together be-

fore the rock, and he said unto them, must we fetch you water out of this rock? And Moses lifted up his hand, and with his rod he smote the rock twice: and the water came out abundantly, and the congregation drank, and their beasts also. And the Lord spake unto Moses and Aaron, Because ye believed me not, to sanctify me in the eyes of the children of Israel, therefore ye shall not bring this congregation into the land which I have given them." Num. 20:7-12. They had the water for all to drink but some how Moses failed God because he struck the rock instead of speaking to it. He manifested unbelief in God.

In Heb. 4:12 we find these words: "Take heed, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief, in departing from the living God." Then going on down to verses 17 through 19 we see these words: "But with whom was he grieved forty years? was it not with them that had sinned, whose carcases fell in the wilderness? And to whom sware he that they should not enter into his rest, but to them that believed not? So we see that they could not enter in because of unbelief." I say this unbelief is one of the leading sins of this generation. The world is filled with unbelief. Cursing, swearing, gambling, cheating, immorality, hatred, killings, and such like all tell us that unbelief is widespread! Listen to Romans 11:19-21: "Thou wilt say then, The branches were broken off, that I might be grafted in. Well; because of unbelief they were broken off, and thou standest by faith. Be not highminded, but fear: For if God spared not the natural branches, take heed lest he also spare not thee."

Of Jesus it was said: "And he did not many mighty works there because of their unbelief." Matt. 13:58. But friends, there is one thing I would like

to impress upon you. God is true whether we believe or not. Hear this from Romans 3:3-4: "For what if some did not believe? shall their unbelief make the faith of God without effect? God forbid: yea, let God be true, but every man a liar; as it is written, That thou mightest be justified in thy sayings, and mightest overcome when thou art judged."

Now to show how God looks at unbelief listen to Rev. 21:8--"But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death." That is where unbelief will lead.

Now let us look at number three: hypocrites. That is not a very good word. But it means: "One who affects virtues or qualities he does not have." He or she pretends something which is not real in their lives. Hypocrisy is the "act of playing a part on the stage." It is "a feigning to be what one is not or to believe what one does not; especially the false assumption of an appearance of virtue or religion." And the Bible has plenty to say about this. Jesus spoke to the scribes and Pharisees and had this to say:

"Ye blind guides, which strain at a gnat, and swallow a camel. Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye make clean the outside of the cup and of the platter, but within they are full of extortion and excess. Thou blind Pharisee, cleanse first that which is within the cup and platter, that the outside of them may be clean also. Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are like unto whited sepulchres, and of all uncleanness.

Even so ye also outwardly appear righteous unto men, but within ye are full of hypocrisy and iniquity. Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! because ye build the tombs of the prophets, and garnish the sepulchres of the righteous, And say, If we had been in the days of our fathers, we would not have been partakers with them in the blood of the prophets." Matt. 23:24-30.

In Job 8:13-14 we find these words: "So are the paths of all that forget God; and the hypocrite's hope shall perish:"

Let us as dear children of God, believe, endure unto the end and not play religion! And now let me briefly point out once again the hindrances to the work of God:

- 1. Unbelief
- Murmuring, complaining and disputing
- 3. Hypocrites.

Our Father, do take the message and bear it to the hearts of the listeners of the broadcast. There are no doubt some who are unhappy and need a divine touch of thy grace. Others need a healing touch. Do the very best for each one and thine shalk be the praise and glory through Christ. Amen.
