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## *“For None of Us Liveth to Himself . . .”*

Radio Broadcast for January 14, 1979

Good morning, friends to one and all on this winter day in January! We hope each and every one of you are keeping warm in your homes, and more than this--warm in your lives and souls with the richest blessings of the Lord. Cold weather alone doesn't make a desolate life, but sin will! Separation from God is indeed, the greatest of all tragedies! First, this text, then a poem and some comments:

"For none of us liveth to himself, and no man dieth to himself." Romans 14:7.

How true! We are not in this world alone. In fact, sometimes we seem to be crowded into this small planet!

One day Frances, and I went grocery shopping. One store we entered was spacious and roomy with wide aisles and only a few customers. It was a joy to push the shopping cart through the aisles and leisurely select our list of groceries from the well-stocked shelves! But alas, this was not the case of another supermarket where we shopped! Many were coming and going, the aisles were well filled. Some perhaps, were shopping for groceries after bad weather had kept them away for days. The check-out lines took considerable time to pass and indeed, we were made to realize that we were not alone in this world! So our lives are affected by others in many different ways. Patience is often required as we learn to live with others here below.

Listen to the way this writer expressed his feeling of being all alone:

### ALONE

Alone, I stand beside Life's stream,  
And watch its surging splash and sheen,  
And long for worlds unseen.

Alone, I note the ebb and flow--  
The tides that come, the tides that go,  
Of human weal and woe.

Alone, I pass on crowded street  
By halls, whose throngs with joy replete

Along Thought's silent avenues,  
As Duty's path I choose.

Alone, I sit at eventide  
Midst fancy's guests, who lurk and hide  
In memory's castle wide.

Alone, I count the sands of Time,  
The shifting scenes of day's decline,  
And turn to realms sublime.

Alone, I press Life's walks--alone!  
As joys of other days have flown,  
Yon heaven holds my own.

Alone I tread upon the brink

Of time's rough rugged shores and think  
Beyond, "I'll pleasures drink."

Alone, ah yes, alone! I wait  
A welcome through the eternal gate  
At close of earthly state.

Alone! yet not alone, I'll glide  
O'er angry waves which worlds divide  
With Jesus by my side.

Let us look again at the scripture:  
"For whether we live, we live unto the Lord; and whether we die, we die unto the Lord: whether we live therefore, or die, we are the Lord's. For to this end Christ both died, and rose, and revived, that he might be Lord both of the dead and living.. But why dost thou judge thy brother? or why dost thou set at nought thy brother? for we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. For it is written, As I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God. So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God." Romans 14:8-11.

Saints should act in all things according to the mind and will of God, and not follow their own wills. The apostle indicates that in all walks of life, one should strive to please God, for he is accountable to him alone for his conduct in everything. God is our master, we must live to him, as we live under his notice and by his mercy; and even when we cease to live among men, we are still in his hand. Therefore, what we do, or what we leave undone, should be in reference to that long eternity which is ever at hand.

We are not our own, but we are the Lord's both in life and death. Christ lived, died and rose again, that he might be the Lord of the dead and the living;

for his power extends equally over both worlds: separate, as well as embodied spirits, are under his authority; and he it is who is to raise even the dead to live: and thus all throughout eternity shall live under his dominion.

We are not the final judge of our brother! It is possible that we might misunderstand our brother and not fully see the motives in his heart! But God knows all this! He it is who will judge the world by Christ Jesus. We are accountable to God for our conduct, and shall be judged at his bar; and let us consider that whatever measure we mete, the same shall be measured unto us again.

We will not be required, at the bar of God, to give account for the conduct of each other, but each shall give account of himself: and let him take heed that he be prepared to do so with joy. Judgment belongs to the Lord, and he will condemn those only who should not be acquitted.

Listen: "Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord." Romans 12:19. Then look at the 20th and 21st verses: "Therefore, if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head. Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good."

Let us remember, at one time we were enemies of God, living in sin, hateful and hating one another. Yet God fed us, clothed us and preserved us alive. Let us do to our enemy the same. Has not the goodness of God and long suffering towards us been the means of breaking our hard hearts and melting them



unto repentance? How do we know that a similar conduct toward our enemies may not also do the same for them? Your kindness may be the means of causing your enemies to see their need of God and coming to repentance, thus being your real friend! Wouldn't that be good?

In quoting from the commentator Adam Clarke, I find he had this to say:

"A moral enemy is more easily overcome by kindness than by hostility—Against the latter he arms himself; and all the evil passions of his heart concentrate themselves in opposition to him who is striving to retaliate, by violence, the injurious acts which he has received from him. But where the injured man is laboring to do him good for his evil—to repay his curses with blessings and prayers, his evil passions have no longer any motive, any incentive; his mind relaxes; the turbulence of his passions is calmed; reason and conscience are permitted to speak; he is disarmed, or, in other words, he finds that he has no use for his weapons; he beholds in the injured man a magnanimous friend, whose mind is superior to all the insults and injuries which he has received, and who is determined never to permit the heavenly principle that influences his soul to bow itself before the miserable, mean, and wretched spirit of revenge. This amiable man views in his enemy a spirit which he beholds with horror, and he cannot consent to receive into his own bosom a disposition which he sees to be so destructive to another; and he knows that as soon as he begins to avenge himself, he places himself on a par with the unprincipled man whose conduct he has so much reason to blame, and whose spirit he has so much cause to abominate. He who avenges himself receives

into his own heart all the evil and disgraceful passions by which his enemy is rendered both wretched and contemptible. There is the voice of eternal reason in "Avenge not yourselves:—overcome evil with good;" as well as the high authority and command of the living God." I really love that and believe it will work wonders through the power of God.

To have Christ enthroned within the soul is to have this great fountain of life; for this "gospel is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth; for therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, The just shall live by faith." When the love of God reigns supreme the soul is filled with all the fulness of God, and the ever flowing fountain is a well of living water, springing up into everlasting life; for, "behold, God is my salvation; I will trust, and not be afraid, for the Lord Jehovah is my strength, and my song; he also is become my salvation. Therefore with joy shall ye draw water out of the wells of salvation. And in that day shall ye say, Praise the Lord, call upon his name, declare his doings among the people, make mention that his name is exalted." Isa. 12:2-4.

And ye "rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory; receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls." 1 Pet. 1:8-9. God never intended that his people should go about lean in their souls, but that they should be fat and flourishing and enjoying the blessings which he has in store for them.

Our Father, bless the word sent forth that it may accomplish the good intended, saving souls, sanctifying believers and encouraging the saints... Heal those who are in need of physical

strength. And lead us continually in the way of life everlasting for we ask it in Jesus name. Amen.

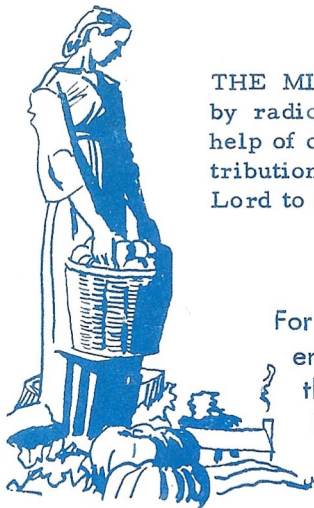
