Good morning to all! On June 14, the day before Father's Day, five of us approached the entrance gates of "Big Mac"! I have read and heard many news reports of the State Penitentiary at Mc-Alester, Oklahoma, but this was to be my first time inside the walls! When we reached the third of the five steel gates, instructions were: "Only two at a time!" So when the steel gate slid open Bro. Jim Wall and I stepped inside. Behind us the gate closed with a click. "Remove all the things from your pockets" was the order. This we did and laid them on the table. "Now, take off your shoes" came the further instructions. This we also did. And the guard gave us the "once over" and the electronic metal detector did not squawkas he moved it up and down over our bodies, so we entered the next gate. In turn Bro. Ted Bock and Bro. Terry Madden entered the room and received the same treatment. Then Bro. Don McIntosh cleared the inspection station. The five of us found ourselves "inside" with many others. It seemed strange and different, realizing that we were "locked in" with all the wire and walls surrounding us.

It was inside these walls where riots had been staged...some years ago certain sections had been burned and destroyed. But here we were, on our own with all the other boys! Evidently, it was recess time and many were moving about in the compound. We walked out into the sunlight and made our way to the little chapel in the library building. Others soon entered and before long we were singing the songs of the gospel, reading the scriptures and expressing our thoughts to these dear young men!

Perhaps by now you know we were there for a gospel service and not because we were forced to go! It was through the request of Bro. Richard Madden who is working with the chaplains and prisoners that I accompanied these dedicated young brethren of his congregation to be in this service during Bro. Richard's absence. After all, did not Jesus say that he came to seek and to save the lost? He came not to call the righteous but sinners to repentance!

I believe I can truly say that I felt at least apart of the same anointing which was prophesied concerning Jesus: "The spirit of the Lord God is upon me; because the Lord hath anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound;" Isa. 61:1

If I can make it clear I would like for it to be understood that the bondage here is not necessarily the bondage of prison walls in the natural sense, although sin often leads to that. But those who are in sin are bound in bondage. Listen to the words of the Jews when they spoke to Jesus:

"They answered him, We be Abraham's seed, and were never in bondage to any man: how sayest thou, Ye shall be made free? Jesus answered them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Whosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin. And the servant abideth not in the house for ever: but the Son abideth ever. If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed." John 8:33-36.

The result of our visit was encouraging. The young men seemed to enjoy singing. One knelt at the altar and prayed. We request that our readers remember them all in prayer.

I am reminded that there are certain

obligations upon the saints to carry out the work of God in the earth. A part of this is to visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction and to keep himself unspotted from the world. Listen to the words of the Lord in that final day:

"Then shall the King say unto them on his righthand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world: For I was an hungered, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger, and ye took me in: Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me: I was in prison, and ye came unto me." Matt. 25:34-36.

There may be exceptions, but I am quite sure that many of the prisons of our day do not exactly compare for punishment with those of the years gone by. The prisons of Bible times were generally dungeons, below ground; some times a cave or pit was used for the purpose. The prisoners were bound, or chained. It must be a wonderful feeling after having been in prison for years to walk out a free man, look up into the heavens and feel that freedom! But let us not get the mistaken idea that all wicked men are behind bars of iron. orthatall in prison are wicked. Sometimes the wicked are upon the streets and put the righteous behind the bars! About the first mention I find in the Bible of prisons concerns Joseph:

"And Joseph's master took him, and put him into the prison, a place where the king's prisoners were bound: and he was there in the prison." Gen. 39:20. This happened because a false report was told about Joseph. The account of the righteous being in prison does not stop with Genesis. It extends all the way to Revelation:

"Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life." Rev. 2:10. And from Genesis to Revelation it is filled in between.

Jeremiah preached the Word against Israel so he got in trouble: "Then Pashur smote Jeremiah the prophet, and put him in the stocks that were in the high gate of Benjamin, which was by the house of the Lord." Jer. 20:2. Again: "Wherefore the princes were wroth with Jeremiah, and smote him, and put him in prison in the house of Jonathan the scribe: for they had made that the prison." Jer. 37:15. Then this third time for Jeremiah: "Then took they Jeremiah, and cast him into the dungeon of Malchiah the son of Hammelech, that was in the court of the prison: and they let down Jeremiah with cords. And in the dungeon there was no water. but mire: so Jeremiah sunk in the mire." Jer. 38:6. That must have been a miserable place.

Sometimes God's preachers suffer persecution because they preach the truth. John the Baptist did: "For Herod himself had sent forth and laid hold upon John, and bound him in prison for Herodias' sake, his brother Philip's wife: for he had married her. For John had said unto Herod, It is not lawful for thee to have thy brother's wife." Mark 6:17-18.

Upon one occasion the apostles suffered because God had been healing: "Then the high priest rose up, and all they that were with him, (which is the sect of the Sadducees,) and were filled with indignation, And laid their hands on the apostles, and put them in the common

prison. But the angel of the Lord by night opened the prison doors, and brought them forth, and said, Go, stand and speak in the temple to the people all the words of this life." Acts 5:17-20. Then Peter and the other apostles answered and said, We ought to obey God rather than men." Acts 5:29.

Peter another time was in prison, but the angel of the Lord came to him. He was in stocks and they just fell off from him. The angel had him to arise. But listen to this: "And the angel said unto him, Gird thyself, and bind on thy sandals. And so he did. And he saith unto him, Cast thy garment about thee, and follow me. And he went out, and followed him; and wist not that it was true which was done by the angel; but thought he saw a vision. When they were past the first and the second ward, they came unto the iron gate that leadeth unto the city; which opened to them of his own accord: and they went out, and passed on through one street; and forthwith the angel departed from him." Acts 12:8-10.

Paul and Silas had experiences in jail too! Once after Paul and Silas had cast out the evil spirit in a young lady they were beaten and put in jail. Listen: "And when they had laid many stripes upon them, they cast them into prison, charging the jailer to keep them safely: Who having received such a charge, thrust them into the inner prison, and made their feet fast in the stocks." Acts 16:23-24. But do you know what happened? That old jail started rumbling in the violent earthquake and the doors came open. Not only were they freed, but the jailer was saved and baptized that very night.

Our Father, bless the message to the

good of every listener. Especially we pray for those behind the prison bars. Give them the faith to know there is deliverance in Thee, both in a physical way and also perfect victory over all the sins and habits of the enemy. Remember those who may be going through trials and sickness. Bless each one we ask it in the name of Jesus! Amen.
