"God Shall Supply Al Your Need . . . "

Radio Broadcast for October 9, 1983

Good morning friends. Listen to this good promise. "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus." Phil. 4:19. This is what I call a real promise! We are living in a time when our needs are so many. We need food which is high in cost. We need clothing which isn't cheap any more and we need a place of shelter from the elements of the weather. None of these things are cheap, but that doesn't matter at all with God. There is no limitation with God. If we need them God is able to give them to us, even if it takes a miracle.

Now consider the promise, "But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus". I like that. My father is rich in houses and lands. He holdeth the wealth of the world in his hand. But this need for food, shelter and clothing only takes care of the outward man. We have far greater needs than this. We need redemption for the soul, grace for our spirits and comfort and joy all along this pilgrim pathway from earth to glory. We need peace and thank God we have found it in Christ. Our righteousness is in him.

Listen again, "Now unto him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think according to the power that worketh in us, Unto him be glory in the church by Christ Jesus throughout all ages, world without end. Amen." Eph. 3:20-21. That, dear ones, is the eternal word of God. I am staking my happiness in this world and the hope of the world to come on that promise, as well as the many others in the Word.

But let us look at a few more of these good things. "And the work of right-eousness shall be peace; and the effect of righteousness quietness and assurance for ever. And my people shall dwell in a peaceable habitation, and in

sure dwellings, and in quiet resting places; When it shall hail, coming down on the forest; and the city shall be low in a low place. Blessedare ye that sow beside all waters, that send forth thither the feet of the ox and the ass." Isa. 32:17-20.

So this matter of serving the Lord is not a state of confusion, but of peace and quietness with a firm assurance. Don't you see how you can rest in these promises? They are firm. The water we have to drink and the air to breathe comes downfrom above from the Father of lights who created and loves us all.

Listen to this prophecy which was fulfilled in Christ: "Behold, the Lord God

will come with strong hand, and his arm shall rule for him: behold, his reward is with him, and his work before him. He shall feed his flock like a shepherd: he shall gather the lambs with his arm, and carry them in his bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young. Who hath measured the waters in the hollow of his hand, and meted out heaven with the span, and comprehended the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales, and the hills in a balance? Who hath directed the Spirit of the Lord, or being his counsellor hath taught him? With whom took he counsel, and who instructed him, and taught him in the path of judgment, and taught him knowledge, and shewed to him the way of understanding? Behold, the nations are as a drop of a bucket, and are counted as the small dust of the balance: behold, he taketh up the isles as a very little thing. And Lebanon is not sufficient to burn, nor the beasts thereof sufficient for a burnt offering. All nations before him are as nothing: and they are counted to him less than nothing, and vanity." Isa. 40:10-17.

Then this gospel prophet Isaiah goes on to Point out the difference between the true God and idolatrous worship. Listen: "To whom then will ye liken God? or what likeness will ye compare unto him? The workman melteth a graven image, and the goldsmith spreadeth it over with gold, and casteth silver chains. He that is so impoverished that he hath no oblation chooseth a tree that will not rot: he seeketh unto him a cunning workman to prepare a graven image, that shall not be moved. Have ye not known? have ye not heard? hath it not been told you from the beginning? have ye not understood from the foundations of the earth? It is he that sitteth upon the circle of the earth, and the inhabitants thereof are as grasshoppers;

that stretcheth out the heavens as a curtain, and spreadeth them out as a tent to dwell in: That bringeth the princes to nothing; he maketh the judges of the earth as vanity. Yea, they shall not be planted; yea, they shall not be sown: yea, their stock shall not take root in the earth: and he shall also blow upon them, and they shall wither, and the whirlwind shall take them away as stubble."

Dear ones, if you are looking for something eternal, you need God, the Creator of the earth and the inhabitants thereof. He wants to be your friend and Savior through His son, Jesus Christ.

Consider these miracles: 1. God closed the mouths of the lions when Daniel was cast before them. Because of this Daniel felt no harm or hurt.

- 2. He controlled the fire for the Hebrew children when they were cast into the furnace because they chose to serve the true God only, and not bow down before the golden image of man.
- 3. The water was pushed back in heaps for God's children to cross on dry land.
- 4. He caused the wind to obey him, and there was a great calm instead of the storm which raged so violently on the
- 5. He fed the multitudes with the loaves and fishes and they were filled and food was left over to be gathered up that none should be wasted.
- 6. He made water to run out of a rock. Then God's children drank and were satisfied.
- 7. He kept the meal and oil from wasting. Therefore, the widow, her son

and the ProPhet lived for many days while the land was suffering from a great drouth.

- 8. He raised Lazarus from the tomb after he had been dead for four days.
- 9. Also Jesus the son of God was raised from the dead and he gives deliverance from sin to all mankind who will believe. Finally, I would like you to hear this declaration and bold assertion from the scriptures: "Wherefore he is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them." Heb. 7:25.

Let us pray. Our Father, we do come unto thee just now. We come with our burdens and needs. No doubt there are those who listen to this broadcast who have great burdens on their hearts because of their sins which weigh them down. We askfor them deliverance and victory. Remove guilt and in its place give peace and pardon for we ask it in Jesus' name, Amen.

Guthrie Floods Again!

After a very dry summer the rains came again to Oklahoma. On Oct. 19th and 20th a steady downfall prevailed much of the time. Some seven or eight inches were received and shortly after dark on the 20th those familiar sounds of the flood siren were heard, but for many it was too late! Within minutes the muddy waters of the swelling Cottonwood Creek began swirling across the streets and into the homes located in an area of some 40 square blocks or more. For Guthrie this was not new but the flood was one which came very swiftly without much warning. Waters crested about 4 a.m. on the 21st but not until after much havoc had been wrought. Some cars stalled and bore all the fury of the flood. When the waters receded there were a great many homes with an accumulation of mud and water, and furniture, carpets, etc., which were greatly damaged or completely ruined! Some reports indicated this flood was a record-breaker for many years, but in our opinion the 1959 flood crested a few inches higher. Nevertheless, it was a disastrous one. The waters covered the floor of the Church of God chapel by approximately three feet and that of the dining hall by almost four feet. Also some of the school tables and the oak Pews sustained damage. At its crest the dirty waters lapped angrily at the sand bags placed at the doors of Faith Pub. House, but only small trickles entered. So the floors and machinery were spared. The Lord also stayed the waters from Bro. Bob Sallee's home after it had covered the front porch and was lapping at the threshold. For many the job of clean-up was a major one.
